

Remarks on Board the Bark Lactitia

Friday January 29th 1858

Commences with moderate breezes from the Southward and cloudy weather saw nothing latter part weather the same
Lat 35.08 N
Long 84.30 W

Saturday 30th

Commences with light winds from the South and pleasant saw finbacks middle and latter part weather the same saw a ship steering to the Northward
Lat 34.53 N
Long 84.21 W

Sunday 31st

Come in with light winds from the S.W. and pleasant middle and latter wind from the N.W. saw a ship steering S by E thus ends
Lat 34.49 N
Long 83.23 W

Monday February 1st

Commences with light winds from the S.W. and pleasant saw finbacks and money porpoise a bark steering S by W middle and latter part weather the same
Lat 34.16 N
Long 82.00 W

Tuesday 2nd

Commences with light winds from the N.W. and pleasant saw finbacks at 6 P.M. the island of Massafuera bearing N.E. dist 40 miles on sail in sight to the S.E. latter part strong breezes
Lat 34.40 N
Long 81.58 W

Cruising for Sperm Whales

Wednesday February 3rd 1858

Commences with strong breezes from the N.W. and cloudy weather saw a bark steering E.S.E. middle part rainy latter part strong breezes from the Southward and cloudy
Lat 34.56 N
Long 81.46 W

Thursday 4th

Come in with strong breezes from the Southward and rugged saw a bark steering E.E. middle and latter part light winds
Lat 33.48 N
Long 81.22 W

Friday 5th

Commences with light breezes from the S.W. and pleasant speak the bark Thomas Pope nineteen months out with twelve hundred and fifty lbs sperm latter part weather the same
Lat 33.12 N
Long 81.34 W

Saturday 6th

Commences with light winds from the S.W. and pleasant speak the ship A Adams thirty five months with 33.50 sperm 400 hump latter part weather the same
Lat 33.27 N
Long 81.02 W

Sunday 7th

Commences with strong breezes from the N.W. and speak the ship A Adams went in a fishing with two boats at the island of Massafuera middle and latter part weather the same saw a whale ship heading to the Southward
Lat 33.24 N
Long 80.09 W
