Friday June 11th 1858
Commences with strong trade and rugged
ship heading South at 6 P.M. tack ship to the
S.E. saw a ship to the Eastward middle
part the latter part heading S. saw a ship
steering N.W. suppose the George & Aueron
Lat. 44° 4' N
Long 110° 34' W

Saturday 12th
Commences with strong trade and rugged
ship heading S by E middle part the same
latter part heading S.E. by S Lat. 45° 7' N
Long 110° 30' W

Sunday 13th
Commences with strong trade and rugged
ship heading S.E. by S saw the B.S. Emily
pass to the leeward three miles off
latter part heading S by E Lat. 45° 7' N
Long 110° 15' W

Monday 14th
Commences with strong trade and rugged
ship heading S by E middle part heading
S.E. latter part heading S.E. Lat. 52° 4' N
Long 110° 12' W

Tuesday 15th
Commences with strong trade and rugged
ship heading S.E. middle and latter part
moderate the Emily in sight to the Westward
Lat. 45° 3' N
Long 109° 54' W

Bark Lactitia

Wednesday June 16th 1858
Commences with moderate trade and pleasant
middle and latter part the same
Lat. 45° 4' N
Long 110° 00' W

Thursday 17th
Commences with moderate trade and pleasant
saw one finback and many porpoise a piece
of squid middle and latter part weather
the same Lat. 45° 8' N
Long 110° 05' W

Friday 18th
Commences with strong trade and squally
one sail in sight to the S.E. middle
and latter part weather the same
Lat. 45° 7' N
Long 109° 50' W

Saturday 19th
Commences with strong trade and
squally middle and latter part moderate
with passing squalls Lat. 53° 57' N
Long 108° 54' W

Sunday 20th
Commences with strong trade and pleasant
ship heading S.E. by E a sail in sight
to the Westward at 6 P.M. tack to the S.E.
middle and latter part squally Lat. 41° 16'
Long 109° 25'

Monday 21st
Commences with strong trade and squally
saw two finbacks middle and latter part
the same Lat. 42° 7'
Long 109° 37' W
