Commences with strong trade and rugged

Wednesday 22nd

Commences with strong trade and rugged
saw two finbacks a piece of squid middle
and latter part pleasant Lat 4.36 N
Long 109.11 W

Thursday 24th

Commences with strong trade and pleasant
saw one finback middle and latter part
heading E by S Lat 3.22 N
Long 107.35 W

Friday 25th

Commences with strong trade and pleasant
ship heading E S E Can Porpoise and
one finback middle and latter part
moderate saw finbacks ship heading S S W
Lat 3.10 N
Long 107.26 W

Saturday 26th

Commences with moderate trade and pleasant
ship heading S S W at 6 P.M. took ship
heading E by S middle part the same
latter part heading S S W Lat 4.29 N
Long 107.38 W

Sunday 27th

Commences with moderate trade and pleasant
at 2 P.M. were three sperm whals at 3 lived
the boats started and killed one took him to the
at 6 P.M. latter part employed at cutting
Lat 4.33 N
Long 109.14 W

employed at boiling speak the ship Secoret

Wednesday 30th

Commences with moderate trade and rugged
ship heading E S E employed at boiling
finished at 8 P.M. middle and latter part
weather the same ship heading S S W by S
Lat 4.15 N
Long 109.03 W

Thursday July 1st

Commences with strong trade and pleasant
ship heading S S W at 4 P.M. took ship to
the E S E middle and latter part the same
saw finbacks Lat 3.48 N
Long 109.55 W

Friday 2nd

Commences with strong trade and rugged
ship heading South Can finbacks and Porpoise
middle part heading S E caught a Porpoise
latter part heading S Lat 4.42 N
Long 108.15 W
