

Remarks on Board the

Friday July 23rd 1858

Commences with strong trade and dark
cloudy weather ship heading E S E middle
part the same latter part steering E
Lat 00.45
Long 82.54 W

Saturday 24th

Commences with strong trade and cloudy
weather ship's course E S E saw one humpback
at 6 P.M. shortened sail and left to the
wind heading E S E middle part the same
latter part moderate steering E S E saw
Porpoise Lat 00.10 S
Long 81.4 W

Sunday 25th

Commences with moderate trade and clear
weather ship's course E S E at left to the
wind heading E S E middle and latter part
calm loved the boats for Blackfish took
fore Lat 00.14 S
Long 81.16 W

Monday 26th

Commences with light air from the S W
and calm middle part weather the same
latter light wind from S W and pleasant
at 10 A.M. made the land Lat 00.22 S
Long 80.39 W

Tuesday 27th

Commences with strong breezes from the
S W saw many humpbacks loved one boat
had no success saw a sail in shore at 6
P.M. shortened sail heading W S W middle
part the same latter part steering off
Lat 00.26 S
Long 80.40 W

Bark Laetitia

Wednesday July 28th 1858

Commences with strong trade and pleasant
steering in for the land at 6 P.M. more ship
heading W shortened sail middle and latter
part moderate saw a Bark heading to the
Eastward Lat 1.19 S
Long 81.07 W

Thursday 29th

Commences with strong trade and pleasant
saw finbacks and Porpoise middle and latter
part moderate Lat 1.04 S
Long 80.96 W

Friday 30th

Commences with moderate trade and pleasant
weather at 6 P.M. Point Galena bearing
E dist. 20 miles middle and latter part
rainy Lat 00.56 S

Saturday 31st

Commences with strong trade passing
fog signals saw many humpbacks and
Blackfish at 6 P.M. Point Galena bearing
E dist. 6 miles middle and latter part
weather the same at 1 A.M. anchored
at Alomus in 40 fathoms water

Aug 1st

Commences with strong trade and pleasant
at 1 P.M. took the anchor stood out to sea
leaving the Ship Saulas and the Sea in sight
middle and latter part moderate Lat 1.48 S
Long 80.37 W
