Saturday Aug 14th 1858

Commences with strong trade and cloudy weather saw two ships heading to the Westward middle and latter part moderate

Long 82.63 W

Sunday 15th

Commences with moderate trade and cloudy weather ship heading N by E at 2 P.M. back ship heading S E by E middle part the same latter part passing fog signals ship heading W by E

Lat 1.14 S
Long 83.08 W

Monday 16th

Commences with moderate trade and cloudy ship heading W on sail in sight to the Eastward at 4 P.M. took ship heading S E by E latter part the same latter heading W by E

Lat 45 S
Long 84.22 W

Tuesday 17th

Commences with light trade and dark cloudy weather ship heading S E saw one finback and many porpoise middle and latter part strong trade

Lat 00.20 S
Long 84.00 W

Wednesday 18th

Commences with moderate trade and cloudy weather ship heading S E by E saw the land at 2 P.M. at 6 took off shore a steamer in sight second S middle part heading W N W latter part heading S E by E no observation

Bark Lactia

Thursday August 19th 1858

Commences with light trade and cloudy weather ship S E middle part heading W N W latter part heading S E by E land the boat for Black fish head no success

Friday 20th

Commences with trade and pleasant ship heading S E at 5 P.M. the island La Plata leaving S E by E per compass dist 6 miles saw many humpbacks back heading W N W middle part the same latter part heading S E

Lat 1.14 S
Long 84.59 W

Saturday 21st

Commences with light trade and cloudy weather ship heading S E by E saw humpbacks at 4 P.M. took off shore middle part the same latter part heading S E

Lat 1.21 S
Long 84.40 W

Sunday 22nd

Commences with light trade and cloudy weather ship heading S E by E middle part heading to the Westward fore hours latter part heading S E by E at 10 P.M. maid Point St. Clara leaving S E dist 25 miles

Lat 2.12 S
Long 80.58 W

Monday 23rd

Commences with light trade and cloudy ship heading S E by E at 6 P.M. Point St. Clara leaving S E dist 30 miles latter part heading in at 9 P.M. raised the island St. Clara leaving E by E dist 10 miles
