Tuesday August 24th 1857
Commences with light trade and pleasant
at 1 P.M. came to anchor off Hemboez

Wednesday Sept 1st
Latter part light winds and pleasant at
10 A.M. took the anchor go under way

Thursday 2nd
Commences with light trade and pleasant
employed at beating at the Gulf of Guayaquil
middle and latter part strong trade and
rough Lat 3.37 N
Long 80.45 W

Friday 3rd
Commences with strong trade and rough
at 6 P.M. Cape Blanco bearing South West
15 miles tack ship off shore middle and latter
part fresh trade Lat 3.52 N

Saturday 4th
Commences with strong trade and rough
at 5 P.M. tack off shore to the windward
Cape Blanco saw a big steering both middle
and latter part weather the same Lat 4.05 N

Sunday 5th
Commences with moderate trade and pleasant
saw humpbacks and blackfish middle and latter
part strong trade Lat 4.56 N

Bark Leticia

Monday Sept 6th 1858
Commences with strong trade and pleasant
saw humpbacks and black fish middle and
latter part weather the same

Tuesday 7th
Commences with moderate trade and pleasant
at five P.M. went on shore at Santa middle
and latter part lying off and on shore ends

Wednesday 8th
Commences with strong trade and pleasant
at 2 P.M. got on board and started off
W.M. middle and latter moderate steering
Lat 5.46 N
Long 80.14 W

Thursday 9th
Commences with moderate trade and dark
cloudy weather ships came S.W. by W. saw
a finback and Porpoise middle and latter part
weather the same Lat 4.46 N

Friday 10th
Commences with light breezes from the N.W.
dark cloudy weather ship heading S.W. by W.
middle and latter part weather the same ship
heading W Lat 2.06 N
Long 86.24 W

Saturday 11th
Commences with light breezes from the N.W.
and passing fog signals ship heading N.W. by W
middle and latter part weather the same
Lat 1.52 N
Long 87.44 W
