Commences with moderate trade and ships course S by E saw one finback middle and latter part the same

Commences with light trade and pleasant ships course S by E middle and latter part light variable winds and calms

Commences with light trade and pleasant ships course S saw finbacks at 4 P.M. steered S by W middle and latter part weather the same loved the Boats for Blackfishs had no success so ends

Commences with light trade and pleasant ships course S by E saw many finbacks middle and latter part strong trade

Tuesday April 12th 1859

Commences with strong trade and pleasant ships course S by E saw one school Blackfish and many finbacks middle and latter part weather the same

Commences with moderate trade and pleasant ships course S by E middle and latter part weather the same saw a school Blackfish

Thursday 14th

Commences with light trade and pleasant ships course S by E at 4 P.M. made the point Ajuga steering S by E hit 20 miles middle and latter part weather the same

Long 81.22 W

Friday 15th

Commences with strong trade steering for Party at 4 P.M. set in thick fog were ship heading off shore middle part off and on latter part heading in for Party

Saturday 16th

Commences with strong trade laying off and on at 4 P.M. the first come on board made sail and steered S by W middle and latter part light trade ships course S by W
