Thursday July 14th 1851

Commences with light trade and pleasant
one sail in sight. at P.M. Abington bearing
E dist 35 miles middle and latter part cloudy
weather. Lat 40.55 N Long 70.55 W

Friday 15th

Commences with light trade and cloudy
weather saw several finbacks at P.M.
Abington bearing South dist 35 miles middle
and latter part strong breezes and squally

Saturday 16th

Commences with strong trade and passing
fog squalls at P.M. Abington bearing
E by S dist 10 miles middle and latter
part weather same

Lat 41.10 N

Long 87.44 W

Sunday 17th

Commences with strong trade and squalls
ship heading E by S middle and latter
part weather the same

Lat 41.42 N

Long 87.47 W

Monday 18th

Commences with moderate trade and passing
fog squalls ship heading E by S saw
many finbacks caught a Porpoise middle
and latter part weather the same

Lat 41.58 N

Long 87.45 W

Back Lachia

Tuesday July 19th 1851

Commences with light trade and pleasant
ship heading E by S saw finbacks middle
part the same latter part strong trade

Lat 42.00 N

Long 84.17 W

Wednesday 20th

Commences with strong trade and squally
ship course E by S middle and latter part
the same saw two ships heading to the
Westward

Lat 40.55 N

Long 84.53 W

Thursday 21st

Commences with moderate breezes from
the S.W. ship course E by S middle and
latter part the same at 10 A.M. raised
the land

Lat 40.25 N

Friday 22nd

Commences with moderate trade and pleasant
at P.M. Point Galary bearing E by S
dist 6 miles middle and latter part weather
the same at 9 A.M. came to anchor at
Alomiles in 6 fathoms of water

Saturday 23rd

Latter part Pleasant took on board a cask
of water at 10 A.M. took the anchor and got
under way

Sunday Aug 1st

Commences with strong trade ship heading
W by S saw several humpbacks middle
and latter part moderate
