Thursday May 17th 1860

Came in with light winds from the S.E. and pleasant ships Course N by W five sails this day broke out and coopered fifteen cask of oil and stowed back middle and latter part squally with rain

Friday May 18th

Came in with light winds from the Eastward and rain squalls several sails in sight ships Course N by W a strong current setting West middle and latter part weather the same ships Course N by E exchange signals with a English man-of-war

Lat 9.41 N

Long 83.02

Saturday May 19th

Came in with light winds from the Eastward and pleasant ships Course N by E several sails seen in sight this day middle and latter part light trade and pleasant

Lat 7.22 N

Long 83.39 W

Sunday May 20th

Came in with light trade and pleasant ships Course N by W employed at cooping oil at 5 P.M. stowed S middle and latter part weather the same

Lat 5.04 N

Long 84.23 W

Bank Lactitia Homenard Bound

Monday May 21st 1860

Came in with light and pleasant ships Course S one sail in sight at 4 P.M. steered N by E saw many birds & flying fish one shoal Porpoise middle part steering N by W latter part steering N by E

Long 85.27

Tuesday May 22nd

Came in with light winds from South to S.E. and rain squalls ships Course N by E saw many birds one shoal Blackfish middle part the same latter part variable winds and rain

Wednesday May 23rd

Came in with light winds from S.W. to S.E. and cloudy weather some rain ships Course N middle and latter part pleasant

Thursday May 24th

Came in with light winds from S.E. and pleasant ships Course S middle and latter part weather the same

Lat 01.26 S

Long 86.29 W

Friday May 25th

Came in with light breezes from S.E. to S.E. and pleasant ships Course N by W middle and latter part light airs and calms plenty of rain

Lat 01.46 S

Long 86.51
