

Whals seen and taken on the voyage

Wednesday May 19th 1866

At 10 Am saw a shoal whals going quick to the SE. led the Boats into the shoal went on and galled the whals after chasing three pods. Struck Boat struck and killed one

Thursday May 25th

At 9 A.M. saw a shoal of Com. whals going SE at 10 A.M. led the Boats to strike and killed one chase the shoal for one hour whals going to the land and being light could not keep up with them

Lat 4.43 N
Long 109.33 W

Friday June 1st

At 9 Am saw a shoal of whals at 1 P.M. led the Boats struck five killed two chased from two but from one Culpaper island leaving E dist 15 miles

Wednesday July 19th

At two P.M. saw a shoal of sperm whals one point in the weather. Boats going to the north and quick heading a boat. At 4 P.M. they were out of sight

Long 86.12 W

Wednesday Sept 19th 1866

At 7 A.M. saw a shoal of whals in company with the Bark. Platina met with her took three to each ship Redoubt rock bearing E. dist 15 miles

Thursday Sept 23rd

Saw whals going quick to the SE. led the Boats had no success North head bearing E dist six miles

Thursday Sept 27th

At midnight saw a shoal whals led the Boats struck three took two chased from one saw the Bark. Platina took one and Matilda saw one or more Redoubt rock bearing E dist 2 miles

Thursday Oct 4th

At 9 Am saw whals struck and killed one North head bearing SE dist 10 miles

Saturday Oct 6th 66

At 9 Am saw a shoal of whals. struck and killed four Redoubt rock bearing E & E dist 15 miles whals going SE. saw the Platina Hickley and Matilda saw whaling
