

Ship La Fayette Towards New Bedford

Monday June 7th

Lat 47. 43 Strong winds from S.E. with thick weather Steering on. Mid part the same. Latter part more moderate set the Steering sails

Tuesday June 8th

Lat 46. 15 Light baffling winds from E. with cloudy weather Steering on. Mid and Latter part more from N.E. to N.W. heading N.W. by N.

Wednesday June 9th

Lat 45. 30 Strong winds at N.E. heading N.W. at 2 P.M. took in Top G. Sails once double reefed the Top sails. Mid part took in Fore & Mizzen Top sails. Latter part a gale from N.E. with thick weather

Thursday June 10

Lat 45. 00 Commenced with a gale from N.E. heading N.W. at 2 P.M. set Fore & Mizzen Top Sails Jib & Spanker. Made part mid shifted to N.W. Latter part heavy gale from N.W. heading N.

Friday June 11th

Lat 44. 10 Commenced with a heavy gale from N.W. heading N. at 12 M. made all sail. Latter part more from S. inclining to the E. sent up J.G. Yards

Saturday June 12th

Lat 42. 23 Strong winds from S.E. and cloudy weather Steering N.E. by N. at 5 P.M. took in Steering sails more inclining to N.E. Mid and Latter part more from N.E.

Sunday June 13th

Lat 41. 55 Strong winds from N.E. heading N.W. at 2 P.M. double reefed the Top sails at 4 P.M. calm and rainy. Mid part light breeze from N. Latter part the same

Monday June 14th

Lat 40. 26 Light breeze from N.E. and cloudy heading N.W. Mid part mid shifted to S.E. Latter part the same sent up m. to yards and set the Steering sails Steering N.E.

Tuesday June 15th

Lat 39. 28 Light breeze from S.E. and clear weather Steering N.E. Mid part calm. Latter part the same on bent the Spanker and mended it

Wednesday June 16th

Lat 38. 30 Light winds from N. and fine weather heading E. N.E. at 3 P.M. bent the Spanker. Mid part light winds from E. N.E. Latter part mid increased to a gale
