 at 10 A.M. heavy squalls of winds
 and rain close reefed topsails
 took in main course gib &
 spanker keeping S.E. by E. Lat 36.55. Long 01.15 W

Monday 4th

Strong breezes from S.W. to N
 with clear pleasant weather
 ships head to the S.E. by E. with
 a large swell from S.W.
 Lat 36.57. Long 01.15 E

Tuesday 5th

Strong heavy winds from N.W.
 at 2 A.M. double reefed topsails
 at 7 A.M. out reefs took a ship
 to the N.E. bearing S.E. Lat 37.37

Wednesday 6th

Heavy gale of winds from N.W.
 running to the S.E. thick weather
 heavy rain. Lat 38.24. Long 14.20 E

Thursday 7th

To ward Pacific Ocean on a whaling
 at 1 P.M. winds N.W. blowing again
 sent the ship of to the S.E. by E
 at 10 A.M. hove two under close
 reefed main top sail and staysails
 fore obscured

Friday 8th

Commenced with a heavy gale
 from N.E. at 1 P.M. blowing a
 perfect hurricane from N.E.
 to N.W. sent down top gallant
 yards at 8 P.M. ship on her beams
 lost the Starboard Boat heavy
 squalls of rain and hail at 11 A.M.
 wore ship fore obscured

Saturday 9th

Blowing a heavy gale from N.W.
 at 11 A.M. shipped a heavy sea
 and took away the larboard Boat
 got the ship before the wind
 and sent before the wind shipping
 mutch water Lat 39.02.

Sunday 10th

First part heavy gale from N.W.
 ship sending under close reefed
 main top sail and fore sail
 with heavy squalls of hail latter
 part more moderate at 7 A.M. out
 reefs set main top gallant sail
 Lat at Noon 38.40. Long 22.29.19 E

Moderate breezes from S.W. to
 N.E. latter part strong winds
 from N.E. at 4 A.M. double
 reefed top sails took in
 main course and gib all appear
 ance of a gale fore obs-
