 Lat 21.33.

Sunday 22nd all hands employed
 in bailing large swell
 from S.W. with fine
 weather Lat 21.27. S Long 112.08

Monday 23rd Strong winds from S.W.
 Ship's head N.W. by W. large swell
 from S.W. all hands employed
 in bailing clear weather with
 passing clouds Lat 21.56. S Long 112.04.

Tuesday 24th Moderate breezes from S.W. with
 clear pleasant weather ship's
 head S.W. at 6 A.M. fin night
 Bailing at 7 A.M. rose ship to
 the Eastward. Lat 22.06. S Long 110.55 E

Wednesday 25th Strong breeze from S.W.
 at 6 A.M. rose ship to the E. wind
 saw great quantities of seal
 Lat 22.00 Long 112.15.15 E

Thursday 26th First part moderate breeze
 from S.W. Middle and
 latter part strong heavy winds
 at 2 A.M. close reefed top sails
 Lat 21.49. Long 112.35.15 E
