squally weather ship's head to
the East ward. Sun obscured

West ward. Lat 14.00

Saturday 9th

Bad weather from W. W. ship's
head E.N.E. saw nothing all this
day Lat 13.30 S

steered by compass E.N.E.

Courses steered by compass E.N.

wose ship to the E.N.E. large swell
from N.W. Sun obscured

Wednesday 20th

Moderate breezes from E. courses
steered N.W. Lat 11.13 S Long 175.45.15

Thursday 21st

at 1 P.M. saw a shoal of whales
going E.N.E. lost 4 Boats caught nothing
Lat 11.15 S
