Wednesday 13th

Strong winds from the East wind
employed in repairing sails at 8. AM
employed in breaking out the run for
Coconuts and found the boat Steers
had by all appearance broken in to the
Ship run and stolen there from
15 gal of rum and 2 do of wine and
34 of brandy and 6 lbs of tobacco

Thursday 16th
Strong winds from E clear
weather with passing clouds at
9 AM rose ship to the Southward
Lat 16.10. Long 176.37.2

Friday 17th
Strong Heavy winds from E
with heavy squalls of rain and wind
at 4 PM double reefed top sails
Lat 16.02. Long 177.07.45 E

Saturday 18th
heavy gales from E with a large
sea at 6 PM took in gib and spanker
at 6 AM close reefed top sails
rose ship to the N.E. by 10

Sunday 19th
Strong breezes from E.N.E. & reefed
top sails at 6 AM rose ship to the
S.E. thick rainy weather sun. obs.

Monday 20th
Commenced this day with a heavy
gale from N.E. Ship's head
to the N.W. by N. sun obscured

Tuesday 21st
heavy gale of wind from N.E. to
N at 6 PM took in fore
top sail gale increasing

at 4 PM took in the boats -

at 1 PM wind shifting to the

the E.N.E. Lat at noon 15.45. 176.24.3

Friday 24th
Moderate breeze from S.E.
with fine weather all possible
sail carried to get to the East
Lat 15.31. 178.50.45

Saturday 25th
fine weather winds from S.E.

Sunday 26th
quiet breezes from S.E. Ship's
head to the East at 4 PM saw the
Keegan Islands bearing East
40 miles at 6 rose ship to the
N.E. at 4 PM stood in for the
land Lat 16.21. Long 179.15.45

Monday 27th
Strong winds from S.E. all possible
sail carried to get to the Eastward

Tuesday 28th
Strong winds from S.E. employed
in beating to windward at 10
AM saw Green bearing East
6 Miles

Wednesday 29th employed in beating
to the East at 6 AM saw the
Isle of Ed. van bearing N.E.
dist 3 Leagues -
