Strong heavy winds from N.E.
at 40. A.M. Spoke Ship Thann
of Sag Harbour 10. Months out with
950. whale 7.50. Sperm Lat 30.00. 176.30

Monday 2nd

Strong heavy winds from N.E.
with thick foggy weather at 2. P.M.
Spoke Bark pioneer of New Bedford
10. Months out with 500. lbs of Sperm
Lat 30.00. Long 177.10. 176

Tuesday 3rd

thick squally weather at 10 A.M.
saw a ship to leeward steering
large swell from N.E. Lat 30.10. 177.00

Wednesday 4th

Moderate breezes from S.E. to S.W.
large swell from N.E. at 6. A.M.
Commence breaking out main
hatch to make stowage
two sail in sight to leeward
Lat 30.14.

Thursday 5th

Strong gale of wind from S.W.
at 10 A.M. hove to under close
reefs main top sail and stay
sails Ship head to the E.N.E.

Friday 6th

heavy gale from S.W. all this day

at 3 A.M. moderate set reefs
Ship head E by N Lat 29.40 Long 173.10.45

Moderate breezes from E.N.E. at 6. A.M.
saw a ship to windward at 8. A.M.
Swath of whales going N. Coast.
3 Boats in chase while in chase
Spoke Ship Chassiot boats in
chase reported Ship Chassiot 9. months
out with 6. Clean at 10. A.M.
towed the boats with out success
made all sail Ship head to
the S.E. Lat 29.48

Monday 9th

First part Moderate breezes from
E.N.E. Ship head to the S.E.
at 6 P.M. hove two under close
reefs main top sail and stay sails
at 6. A.M. Strong winds from N.E.
at 8. A.M. Sailed of S.E. one ship
in sight to the Southward
3 reefs in the top sail Lat 30.46.5.

Tuesday 10th

This day commences with a
gale of wind from E.N.E. laying
to under close reefs main top
sail and stay sails Sun obscured

Wednesday 11th

Blowing a gale from E.N.E.
Ship head to the northward
Sun obscured no observation

Thursday 12th

heavy gale of wind from E.N.E.
laying to under close reefs main top sail
and stay sails

Friday 13th

through out this day a gale
of wind from N.E. Ship head to the
southeastward
