Saturday 23rd Lat 34.07 Long 168.20

Moderate breezes from W. at 1 P.M.
saw 3 sail to the S.E. W. at 4 P.M.
saw a shoal of whales chased 3 boats
caught one large sperm whale
at 8 P.M. spoke ship falcon of
New Bedford 16 months out with 2100
bls of whale oil & 200 of sperm
at 7 A.M. took from the Galatin
2000 lbs of bread & 35 galls of Malasses
and a quantity of chops Lat 34.15 Long 168.30

SE imployed in cleaning bone
at 8 A.M. saw three right whales
Lat 40.58.5 Long 166.46

Saturday 30th

calm breezes with light winds from N
courses steered E. at 6 A.M. saw
several right whales chased 3 boats
caught 2 at 9 A.M. took the whales
along side at 11 Com mence cutting
these whales fills the ship
Lat 41.22.5 Long 166.00

Sunday Dec 1st

Moderate breezes from N.E. to E. & S.E.
at 7 P.M. fin sight cutting remainder
part imployed in boiling and setting
up shooks saw several whales of
deck and a great quantity of feed
all drawing sail set to advantage
home wind bound Lat 41.28 Long 165.25

to the SE wind think rainy weather
