Monday 13th

Strong heavy winds from N.W. at 4 P.M. set
single reefed top sails and main top gallant
reef gibs and spanker thick rain weather
latter part brisk wind and clear day
sun obscured no observation

Tuesday 14th

Moderate breezes from N.W. to N.E.
with thick rainy weather ship's head
to the N.W. sun obscured

Wednesday 15th

Strong winds from N to N.W. ship's head
to the East ward latter part greatly
employed in making a top sail Lat 32.28 Long 29.56

Thursday 16th

First part strong heavy squalls of wind and rain
from N.W. middle part calm latter
part light breeze from N. sun obscured

Friday 17th

Moderate breezes from N with clear weather
at 9 A.M. took ship to the E by N Lat 30.11 Long 29.05

Saturday 18th

Moderate breezes from N all
possible sail carried to advantage
getting to windward at 6 P.M. saw a
sail to the N.W. Lat 29.44 S

Light breeze and calms with a smooth sea
at 10 P.M. took ship to the N.W. Lat 29.10 Long 29.00
