 this 24 hours commences with midrait breezes from  
 the SE force 8 men in employ making span yarn  
 and other work saw porpoises mid & later part light  
 winds men in play sewing up span & other work  
 and so ends this 24 hours

Sat 30-16 S  
 Remarks on board Friday February 26<sup>th</sup> 1841  
 this 24 hours commences with the midrait breezes  
 from the South force 8 men in employ making  
 span yarn mid & later part light winds men  
 in employ fitting rigging and other work fill up the  
 boat and feed one basket of bread and so ends this 24  
 hours

Sat 24-32 S  
 Remarks on board Saturday February 27<sup>th</sup> 1841  
 this 24 hours commences with light winds from  
 the Westward being South men in employ fitting  
 rigging and fitting rigging boats mid & later part cal m  
 & heavy rain washed the ship & so forth and so ends  
 this 24 hours no observation

Remarks on board Sunday February 28<sup>th</sup> 1841  
 this 24 hours commences with calm weather and severe rain  
 at 20 Bu took 8 breezes from the SE & square the  
 yards & staved at sun set double reef the top sails and  
 fill main sail & 1/2 bale up the fore sail mid & later  
 part strong winds at 12 o'clock had in the wind to the  
 Southward at 3 there round and hove to the Westward & Cal m  
 at day light saw the land bearing N 3/4 E distance 5 leagues  
 saw on sail at 8 distance saw porpoises & so ends this 24  
 hours

Sat 26-10 S  
 Remarks on board Monday February 29<sup>th</sup> 1841  
 this 24 hours commences with Breeze breezes from the  
 SE and blowing rather at sun set double reef the top  
 sails & fill the 1/2 bale mid & later part strong winds and blowing  
 Westward men in employ fitting rigging & other work and so ends  
 this 24 hours

Sat 23-31 S  
 Remarks on board Tuesday February 30<sup>th</sup> 1841  
 this 24 hours commences with strong winds from the  
 SE force 8 men in employ fitting rigging at sun set  
 fill fore sail 1/2 bale & main sail mid & later part midrait  
 winds in employ fitting rigging & other work and so ends this  
 24 hours

Sat 21-31 S

Remarks on board Wednesday February 31<sup>st</sup> 1841  
 this 24 hours commences with midrait winds from the  
 SE force 8 men in employ fitting rigging & boats  
 mid & later part midrait winds at 10 a.m. passed under  
 the hatches and smoke in the fore to kill rats and so ends  
 this 24 hours saw black fish & porpoises

Sat 14-30 S  
 Remarks on board Thursday March 3<sup>rd</sup> 1841  
 this 24 hours commences with midrait winds from the  
 SE men in employ fitting rigging painting boats and  
 other work mid & later part midrait winds force 8 men  
 saw porpoises & black fish at 4 o'clock raised the hatches  
 and bled all hands water of and main sail and so ends this  
 24 hours

Sat 14-01 S

Remarks on board Friday March 4<sup>th</sup> 1841  
 this 24 hours commences with midrait winds from  
 the SE saw breeches laid and they forced to be  
 black fish at sun set took in sail & bled the main  
 yard & black mid & later part midrait breezes at day  
 light bled all hands main sail and staved N 3/4 E painted  
 one boat fill up the boat and so ends this 24 hours

Sat 16-33 S  
 Remarks on board Saturday March 5<sup>th</sup> 1841  
 this 24 hours commences with midrait winds from  
 the SE force 8 men spoke the barque Gingsvorn of  
 Sweden Capt Roberson 16 merits out 1250 sperm oil men  
 in employ fitting ship mid & later part midrait winds from  
 the SE at day light main all sail and heading in shore at 4 a.m.  
 saw the land men in employ fitting ship and so ends this 24  
 hours

Sat 15-35 S

Remarks on board Sunday March 6<sup>th</sup> 1841  
 this 24 hours commences with midrait winds from the  
 SE at 12 o'clock took in and hove in shore spoke the Briggs  
 Gorden of Sweden men in employ fitting rigging at sunset took in  
 sail and hove in half of the St. Wright each way at day light bled  
 all hands main sail saw one barque and so ends this 24 hours  
 saw porpoises

Sat 16-10 S

Remarks on board Monday March 7<sup>th</sup> 1841  
 this 24 hours commences with midrait winds from the  
 SE at 4 a.m. took in and hove in shore mid & later part  
 light winds saw several fish men in employ fitting ship and so ends  
 this 24 hours
