

Remarks on Board Tuesday March 7th 1841
This 24 hours commences with midnight tides from the
S.E. men employ firing ship spoke the Barge
Fore part of fore main mast going in masts out 100
lbs of Spanish tallow in sail at sun set and stow half of
the Periscope each way at day light call all hands and
main sail and stow in shore at 10 o'clock tacked of shore
at a low and bawled in skins fish and birds this 24 hours
Sat

Remarks on Board Wednesday March 8th 1841
This 24 hours commences with light tides from the S.E.
men employ firing ship and one Barge and one
brig took in sail at sun set and held the main
sails & fore main & later part midnight tides at day
light call all hands main sail broke out and pile up 3
cups of water in the Barber room and saw below and over
this 24 hours Sat 17-00 S

Remarks on Board Thursday March 9th 1841
This 24 hours commences with midnight tides from the
S.E. heaving to the South West at 2 P.M. saw one sail
steering to the North West got out 8 set of ours for the Boat
Boat at sun set took in main top gallant sail & flew
tacked ship and stow in shore mile & later part midnight
tides at day light call all hands main sail at 10th saw
black fish but did not spare and so ends this 24 hours
Sat 18-00 S

Remarks on Board Friday March 10th 1841
This 24 hours commences with midnight tides from the
S.E. men employ at ships victory at noon tacked ship
and heaved in shore took in sail at sun set mile & later part
midnight tides call all hands and so ends this 24 hours.
Sat 17-00 S

Remarks on Board Saturday March 11th 1841
This 24 hours commences with midnight tides from the
S.E. heaving on the wire to the Eastward at sun set
saw whale but did not spare they were going
to fast four miles & later part Bristle tides at day
light call all hands main sail and stow to the
Northward and so ends this 24 hours
Sat 17-00 S

Remarks on Board Sunday March 12th 1841
This 24 hours commences with Bristle tides from the
S.E. Cruising for whails men employ at ships victory
mile & later part Bristle tides at day light call all
hands main sail and stow in shore saw five backs
and so ends this 24 hours Sat 16-30 S

Remarks on Board Monday March 13th 1841
This 24 hours commences with Bristle tides from
the S.E. Cruising for whails saw one turtle
took in sail at sun set and heaved in shore mile
& later part strong tides at day light call all hands
main sail saw plenty of blimp backs mending sails
and so ends this 24 hours Sat 15-24 S

Remarks on Board Tuesday March 14th 1841
This 24 hours commences with strong tides from
the S.E. saw Pentagon of blimp backs on Bent the fore
top sail and Bent & rather one and on Bent the fore
top gallant sail took in sail at sun set mile & later
part strong tides men in flops mending sails saw
five backs and so ends this 24 hours
Sat 15-16 S

Remarks on Board Wednesday March 15th 1841
This 24 hours commences with strong tides from
the S.E. saw the land Bent fore top gallant sail & Bent
took in sail at sun set mile & later part light tides
saw blimp backs men employ mending sails and so
ends this 24 hours the same distance always

Remarks on Board Thursday March 16th 1841
This 24 hours commences with calm with sea blimp
backs & Spanish fish men employ mending sails
mile & later part light tides call all hands at day light
main sail and stow at 11th saw plenty of blimp backs
mending sail and at 12th saw whails and so ends
this 24 hours Sat 14-49

Remarks on Board Friday March 17th 1841
This 24 hours commences with light tides from the
S.E. Case W.W. saw plenty of blimp backs
took in sail at 10th mile & later part calm bawled
one snow fish saw five backs & blimp backs men employ
mending sails and so ends this 24 hours
Sat 14-33 S

Remarks on Board Saturday March 18th 1841
This 24 hours commences with calm neither men employ
mending sail saw five backs took in sail at 10th horse
W.W. mile & later part calm saw grape houses Bent
main top sail & main top gallant sail and so ends this 24
hours Sat 14-24 S
