 This 24 hours commences with brisk breezes from the S.W. at 1 P.M. ship off to the N. & Westward took in a top galant sails at dark and hove on the wind to the Westward saw the land at 12 o'clock bearing E distance 5 leagues mile & later part light winds saw porpoises and so ends this 24 hours
 Sat 00-40 N

Remarks on board Tuesday June 1 1841
 This 24 hours commences with light winds from the N.W. bearing for wharves before employed making sun runs men at ships duty took over top galant sails at dark & fly 8th mile & later part moderate winds and good weather saw plenty of porpoises & small fish and so ends this 24 hours Sat 00-41 N

Remarks on board Wednesday June 2 1841
 This 24 hours commences with moderate winds from the S.W. bearing to the Westward men employed at ships duty saw plenty of porpoises took over top galant sails at dark mile & later part moderate winds saw porpoises & finbacks and so ends this 24 hours bearing the wind and so ends this 24 hours
 Sat 00-42 N

Remarks on board Thursday June 3 1841
 This 24 hours commences with moderate winds from the West and bearing to the Southern & Western men employed took over ship took over top galant sails at dark mile & later part brisk breezes and plenty of rain and thick weather and so ends this 24 hours observation

Remarks on board Friday June 4 1841
 This 24 hours commences with brisk breezes and plenty of rain bearing of shore took over top galant sails at 1 P.M. mile & later part brisk breezes and good weather saw porpoises and so ends this 24 hours
 Sat 00-43 N

Remarks on board Saturday June 5 1841
 This 24 hours commences with brisk trade from the S.W. men employed at ships duty. Calmer weathering rain mile & later part moderate trade saw porpoises & plenty of small fish and so ends this 24 hours
 Sat 01-16 S

Remarks on board Sunday June 6 1841
 This 24 hours commences with brisk trade from the S.W. took ship at 1 P.M. and hove of shore mile & later part brisk trade and blowing with rain
 Sat 01-44 N

Remarks on board Monday June 7 1841
 This 24 hours commences with breezes from the S at 3 P.M. saw the land on sail in sight mile & later part strong trade and heavy sea saw black fish men employed at ships duty and so ends this 24 hours observation

Remarks on board Tuesday June 8 1841
 This 24 hours commences with strong trade from the S saw black fish near ship at 1 P.M. double reefed the top sails at dark bearing E.S.E. and blowing with rain & later part strong trade with heavy sea saw black fish and so ends this 24 hours observation

Remarks on board Wednesday June 9 1841
 This 24 hours commences with strong trade from the S bearing E.S.E. with thick weather men employed taking down yards & 60 fath. took in sail at dark and took of shore mile & later part strong trade saw plenty of black fish & finbacks and so ends this 24 hours
 Sat 3-30 S

Remarks on board Thursday June 10 1841
 This 24 hours commences with brisk trade from the S saw the land took in at 1 P.M. saw a sail at distance took in sail at dark and hove of shore mile & later part strong trade saw hump backs & black fish took ship at 10 P.M. and so ends this 24 hours
 Sat 4-05 S

Remarks on board Friday June 11 1841
 This 24 hours commences with strong trade from the S bearing of shore with heavy sea double reefed the top sails at 1 P.M. filled the lower sail and took in at dark mile & later part strong trade saw black fish & porpoises & hump backs men employed making stowage and so ends this 24 hours
