The 24 hour compasses with moist winds from the
the S.W. and plenty of rain with strong breezes
later part light winds with plenty of rain all the 24
hours thick overcast

Remarks on board Saturday January 15th 1842
The 24 hour compasses with moist winds from the S.W.
with plenty of rain at 3 P.M. took ship and hauled
S. hauled 2 in the night saw 1 ship at distance saw
porpoises thick overcast with squalls of rain

Remarks on board Sunday January 16th 1842
The 24 hour compasses with moist winds from the S.W. with
cloudy weather and plenty of rain with later part the same
Sat 1:45 P

Remarks on board Monday January 17th 1842
The 24 hour compasses with light breezes from the S.W.
Spoke the ship *Thornton* of Salem Capt. Rose
16 knots out 1000 of whale 400 lbs sperm took in 50 gallons sails
at dark and hauled S.W. off. with part light winds
made all sail at day light saw 1 sail at distance
Sat 1:54 P

Remarks on board Tuesday January 18th 1842
The 24 hour compasses with light winds from the S.W.
hauled S.W. at 3 M. hauled to S.W. took ship and
steered S.W. took in 50 lbs of sperm top galeant sail at dark
mile part rain with light winds at day light made all
sail saw 2 sail at distance
Sat 1:35 P

Remarks on board Wednesday January 19th 1842
The 24 hour compasses with moist winds from the S. hailing
W.S.W. took ship at 3 P.M. and hauled S.E. saw 3 sail at distance
took in fore & main top galeant sail & fly jib at dark mile & later
part light winds made all sail at day light saw several sail
at distance

Remarks on board Thursday January 20th 1842
The 24 hour compasses with light winds from the S.W. hailing W.
saw several sail took in light sails at dark mile & later
calm later part light winds made all sail at day light
saw 3 sail and so ends the 24 hours
Sat 1:20 P

Remarks on board Friday January 21st 1842
The 24 hour compasses with light winds from the W.S.W. hailing
S. opened the main top sail and bent 4 new rope poles
the ship *Brant* of New Bedford Capt. Adams 27 knots out
450 lbs took in fore & main top galeant sails & fly jib
at dark mile part light winds made all sail at day light
saw 1 sail at distance No observation

Remarks on board Saturday January 22nd 1842
The 24 hour compasses with light winds from the Southern hailing W.
took ship at 3 P.M. and hailing S.E. saw 1 sail at distance
mile & later part moist winds saw humpbacks men in log
at ships delay
Sat 00:25 P

Remarks on board Sunday January 23rd 1842
The 24 hour compasses with moist winds from the S.E. hailing
W.S.W. mile & later part brisk winds saw porpoises & C.
Sat 00:32 P

Remarks on board Monday January 24th 1842
The 24 hour compasses with strong trade winds from the S.E.
at 6 P.M. feet of W.S.W. mile part brisk trade at 10 A.M. raised
whales were fished and 600 lbs took them & long side and
went on chais after more and on with chaising whails

Remarks on board Tuesday January 25th 1842
The 24 hour compasses with good weather wind S.E. all hands employed
chaising whails gave them up at 2 got 4 Bows at 5 P.M. got up
tackles and got ready for fishing took in sail and let her lay
mile part moist with or calm all hands at day light and let in
our whails finished at 4 A.M. made sail and commenced clearing
I say the heads and so ends the 24 hours
Sat 00:36 P Long 94-10 W

Remarks on board Wednesday January 26th 1842
The 24 hour compasses with moist trade winds from the S.E. all hands
employed clearing & rigging heads finished at 4 A.M. & started the
works boiling head oil finished at 2 A.M. and commenced on the
Briar ends with good weather and all hands employed
hogging out oil
