Remarks on board Monday February 21 1842
 the 24 hour comers with light winds from the S.E. heaving
 6 1/2 mile & later part light winds men employed painting
 water walls & 6 Sat 21 = 29 S

Remarks on board Tuesday February 22 1842
 the 24 hour comers with light winds from the S.E. to S
 mile part calm men employed painting water walls & 6
 mile & later part light winds and sun rain
 Sat 22 = 10 S

Remarks on board Wednesday February 23 1842
 the 24 hour comers with light winds from the S.W. heaving S.E.
 to S.E. saw one sail at a distance from 1/2 strong breeze setting
 S mile part calm later part strong gale from S.E. steering
 S.E. Sat 23 = 0 S

Remarks on board Thursday February 24 1842
 the 24 hour comers with moirant winds from the S.W. from 1
 to 4 miles half to S.W. and then side S.W. calm at 10
 P.M. took a light breeze from the S.E. heaving 6 1/2 with heavy swell
 from the N.W. mile & later part light winds
 Sat 24 = 34 S

Remarks on board Friday February 25 1842
 the 24 hour comers with light winds from the S.E. heaving 6 1/2
 with a heavy swell from the S.E. mile & later part moirant
 winds spoke the ship Ocean of Rotterdam 10 months out 200 tons
 Sat 25 = 34 S

Remarks on board Saturday February 26 1842
 the 24 hour comers with moirant winds from the S.E. heaving
 6 1/2 hauled ship at 6 P.M. hauled & gain 10 1/2 P.M. mile
 part light winds raised whails at 4 P.M. laid at 9 the
 whails were hauled to the windward by fast for us came &
 Bouré & 6 Sat 26 = 0 S

Remarks on board Monday February 27 1842
 the 24 hour comers with light winds from the S.E. heaving
 6 1/2 mile part calm later part light winds from the S
 Sat 27 = 30 S

Remarks on board Tuesday February 28 1842
 the 24 hour comers with light winds from the S. steering 6 1/2
 mile & later part light breezes saw plenty of blackfish
 men employed at ships duty Sat 28 = 13 S

Remarks on board Wednesday March 1 1842
 the 24 hour comers with light winds from the S. Course 6
 saw plenty of Blackfish men employed at ships duty
 at 4 P.M. raised whails laid at a struggle and laid 1 took them
 & long side at 12 got dinner for no observation

Remarks on board Thursday March 2 1842
 the 24 hour comers with moirant winds from the N.W. all
 hands employed cutting in whails raised whails at 2 P.M.
 finished cutting at 4 1/2 P.M. passed and laid one whail took him
 & long side and started the works comers looking for
 mile part light winds hauled down at day light and put in our
 whails clear & way the hands got dinner & started the works
 Sat 2 = 47 S Long 93 = 15 W

Remarks on board Friday March 3 1842
 the 24 hour comers with moirant winds from the S.W. all hands
 employed hauling oil more ship at 6 P.M. and laid off N.W. more
 & gain at 11 mile part moirant winds with light squalls
 of rain Sat 3 = 40 S

Remarks on board Saturday March 4 1842
 the 24 hour comers with moirant winds from the S.W. all hands
 employed hauling base of oil raised whails at 1 1/2 P.M. laid at 4
 fastened and laid one took him & long side at 5 1/2 got supper and
 started the works mile & later part light winds with
 cold all hands at day light and put in the whails finished at 4 P.M.
 with plenty of whails in sight laid at 12 Long 93 = 15 W
 Sat 4 = 11 S

Remarks on board Sunday March 5 1842
 the 24 hour comers with light winds from the S.W. all hands
 employed whaling fastened and laid one took him & long side
 started the works hauled down at day light and put in our whails
 finished at 9 and started the works all hands employed hauling base
 of oil Sat 5 = 44 S
