

Remarks on board Sunday April 3rd 1842

There are 24 hours commenced with moderate winds from the SSW at 2 Pm saw the island of Guadalupe one of the Galapagos being 18 1/2 leagues distant took ship at dusk and held 1 1/2 light ship at day light and held 18 3/4 miles with moderate winds
Lat 1 = 44 N Long 93 = 11 W

Remarks on board Monday April 4th 1842

There are 24 hours commenced with moderate winds from the SSW saw Guadalupe island at 1 Pm having 6 1/2 leagues at 3 o'clock Pm raised whales going up to the windward land at 4 but did not observe much part moderate winds being west by north ship at 4 later part light winds
Lat 1 = 11 N

Remarks on board Tuesday April 5th 1842

There are 24 hours commenced with light winds from the SSW cruising for whales saw plenty of black fish men employed at ships setting middle & later part light winds
Lat 1 = 12 N

Remarks on board Wednesday April 6th 1842

There are 24 hours commenced with light winds from the SSW cruising for whales steering 1/2 mile part light winds at 4 Pm raised whales land struck and killed took them at long side got dinner ends with moderate winds
Lat 1 = 42 N Long 93 = 36 W



Remarks on board Thursday April 7th 1842

There are 24 hours commenced with moderate winds from the SSE commenced boiling at 12 finished at 2 Pm made sail and steared for the whales came up with them at dusk too late for to lose set the watch and commenced boiling every mile and later part moderate winds cruising for whales
Lat 1 = 41 N

Remarks on board Friday April 8th 1842

There are 24 hours commenced with moderate winds from the SE all hands employed boiling oil middle & later part moderate winds finished boiling at 6 Pm
Lat 2 = 13 N

Remarks on board Saturday April 9th 1842

There are 24 hours commenced with moderate winds from the SE cruising for whales saw one barrel middle & later part moderate winds cruising for whales
Lat 2 = 45 N Long 93 = 12 W

Remarks on board Sunday April 10th 1842

There are 24 hours commenced with moderate winds from the SE being to the N & W wind at 2 Pm raised whales land at 4 fastened and killed 3 took them at long side at 4 Pm middle part plenty of rain at day light commenced boiling finished at 4 Pm cleared & day the heads & 60 raised whales at 11 10 miles of breaching took ship at 12 and held for them and so ends the 24 hours
Lat 3 = 10 N Long 93 = 12 W

Remarks on board Monday April 11th 1842

There are 24 hours commenced with moderate winds from the SE steering for whales land at 3 Pm fastened and saw 2 took them at long side and commenced boiling took in sail and and let her pull at day light killed 2 and got ready for putting raised whales land struck and killed 3 saw 2 took them at long side but in a got dinner & 60
Lat 3 = 36 N Long 93 = 27 W

Remarks on board Tuesday April 12th 1842

There are 24 hours commenced with moderate winds from the SE all hands employed boiling in whales finished at 2 Pm cleared & day 2 heads & 60 middle part light squalls of rain all hands employed boiling oil
Lat 3 = 47 N Long 93 = 12 W

Remarks on board Wednesday April 13th 1842

There are 24 hours commenced with light winds from the SSW all hands employed boiling oil middle & later part plenty of rain got up at morning and finished boiling at 12 and commenced boiling fat lean and so ends the 24 hours
Lat 3 = 54 N
