

Remarks on board Friday April 29 1842

There are 24 hours bonanzas with brisk winds from the S heading ESE saw breacher blackfish men employed at ship duty midle & later part brisk breezes Cooper employed making repairs saw breacher run for them did not see them after midle

Lat 3 = 14 N

Remarks on board Saturday April 30 1842

There are 24 hours bonanzas with brisk winds from the S heading ESE set up fore top galant riges back stis root riges & 60 mile part thick over cast later part the same

Lat 2 = 55 N

Remarks on board Sunday May 1 1842

There are 24 hours bonanzas with brisk winds from the S heading ESE men employed at ship duty bonanz withing hole this day midle & later part modrat winds

Lat 2 = 30 N

Remarks on board Monday May 2 1842

There are 24 hours bonanzas with brisk winds from the S heading ESE midle & later part modrat breezes and cloudy wither men employed at ship duty midle & new fore stay & 60

Lat 2 = 18 N

Remarks on board Tuesday May 3 1842

There are 24 hours bonanzas with modrat winds from the S heading ESE with thick over cast men employed at ship duty midle & later part modrat breezes from the S to SSE heading E & ESE

Lat 2 = 14 N

Remarks on board Wednesday May 4 1842

There are 24 hours bonanzas with modrat winds from the SSE heading ESE at 10 PM came up to 6 mile part modrat winds and good wither fairing all sail current setting 11 PM 2 miles per hour men employed at ship duty midle & later part modrat winds

Lat 2 = 13 N

Remarks on board Thursday May 5 1842

There are 24 hours bonanzas with modrat winds from the SE heading ESE at 1 PM came up to 6 PM men employed fitting riges midle & later part modrat winds bonanz painting in side mated down stabord side main riges & 60

Lat 2 = 29 N

Remarks on board Friday May 5 1842

There are 24 hours bonanzas with brisk winds from the S heading ESE men employed painting boot works fitting riges & 60 set in fore & mizen top galant sails at dark midle & later part Septel breezes fore down the stabord side of the main riges & 60

Lat 2 = 11 N

Remarks on board Saturday May 6 1842

There are 24 hours bonanzas with modrat winds from the S heading ESE men employed fitting and tearing down riges midle & later part light winds saw blackfish & porpoise

Lat 1 = 45 N

Remarks on board Sunday May 7 1842

There are 24 hours bonanzas with light winds from the S heading ESE men employed fitting riges painting ship midle & later part modrat winds

Lat 1 = end

Remarks on board Monday May 8 1842

There are 24 hours bonanzas with modrat winds from the SSE heading SE at 2 PM saw a sail at a distance at 4 PM latter sail steaming to the N midle & later part modrat winds broke out and stole down 20 lbs of oil saw one sail at a distance

Lat 4 = 04 N

Remarks on board Tuesday May 9 1842

There are 24 hours bonanzas with light winds from the SSE heading SE all hands employed staining down oil and booping meat midle & later part light winds clean ship for painting

Lat 60 = 40 N

Remarks on board Wednesday May 10 1842

There are 24 hours bonanzas with light winds from the S heading SE spoke the ship Ringstone of Nantucket Capt. Russell 22 months out 400 lbs midle & later part modrat winds bonanz painting in side

Lat 60

Remarks on board Thursday May 11 1842

There are 24 hours bonanzas with brisk winds from the S heading to the SE & wind saw the ship Ringstone at distance at 4 PM finished painting in side midle & later part brisk winds Cooper top galant sails at dark saw plenty of blackfish

Lat 60 = 16 S
