S men employed at ship's duty bent the old main
top sail, middle & later part attended with light
squalls of rain Sat

The 24 hours commenced with brisk winds from the
SSE steering to middle & set of ship's duty bent the
top sail, middle & later part strong
traces attended with squalls of rain took in the
light sails at dark and steared by the wind and held it
16 30 saw the ship Boze of Vassar at a distance
Sat 2:44 P

The 24 hours commenced with strong winds from
the SSE heading to 33 mile & later part
moderate winds men employed at ship's duty

Remarks on board Sunday July 10th 1842
The 24 hours commenced with light winds from
the SSE cruising for whales middle & later part
moderate winds Sat 2:00 P

Remarks on board Monday July 11th 1842
The 24 hours commenced with moderate winds from
the SSE steering to the S with good weather
middle & later part moderate winds men employed
at ship's duty Sat 1:57 P

Remarks on board Tuesday July 12th 1842
The 24 hours commenced with moderate winds from the
SSE heading to 33 saw fireworks & forges middle &
later part strong winds at a saw branches about
the fore top sail and bent it new one and bent it new
main top gulant sail Sat 1:12 P Long & large

Remarks on board Wednesday July 13th 1842
The 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the SSE
cruising for whales at a saw whales at a land struck
and braced the line and so had luck to day middle &
later part moderate winds Sat 1:19 P

Remarks on board Thursday July 14th 1842
The 24 hours commenced with moderate winds from the SSE
with blowing with men employed mending sails
more ship at a saw and headed SSE at very high main
sail and steared for it whale but did not find them ends
with light winds Sat 1:34 P

Remarks on board Friday July 15th 1842
The 24 hours commenced with moderate winds from the S
cruising for whales men employed mending sails bent
the fore top sail and commenced mending the main
top sail ends with moderate breezes Sat

Remarks on board Saturday July 16th 1842
The 24 hours commenced with moderate winds from the SSE
heading to 36 men employed mending sails middle & later
part moderate winds with light squalls of rain
Sat 2:49 P

Remarks on board Sunday July 17th 1842
The 24 hours commenced with moderate winds from the
SSE with blowing with men employed mending sails
the fore top sail and commenced mending the main
top sail ends with sun rain Sat

Remarks on board Monday July 18th 1842
The 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the
SSE at a saw branches 4 points of the le bow left off
saw branches at 1 and at 2 and when saw them more
middle & later part moderate winds men employed at
ship's duty Observation

Remarks on board Tuesday July 19th 1842
The 24 hours commenced with winds from the SSE at 12
saw the land distance 10 leagues more ship at dark
and steared NPP middle & later part strong winds
with a thick overcast

Remarks on board Wednesday July 20th 1842
The 24 hours commenced with brisk winds from the SSE
Boze NPP men employed at ship's duty middle & later
part strong winds saw 8 barcesses Sat 2:57 P
