

Remarks on board Thursday July 21st 1842
 the 24 hours barometer with brisk winds from the SSW
 at 5th sea. I sail at a distance I feared to be it
 on sailing mile & later part moderate winds with
 sun rising spoke the ship. Anchor of the ship for
 Capt. McPherson 12 miles out 600 fms
 Sat 3 - 09 N

Remarks on board Friday July 22nd 1842
 the 24 hours barometer with moderate winds from the
 SSW bearing for whales mile & later part moderate
 winds men in place at ship's duty
 Sat 3 - 06 N

Remarks on board Saturday July 23rd 1842
 the 24 hours barometer with moderate winds from the SSW
 bearing W men in place at ship's duty mile & later
 part strong breezes with squalls of rain
 Sat 3 - 32 N

Remarks on board Sunday July 24th 1842
 the 24 hours barometer with brisk winds from the SSW
 bearing W saw one ship at a distance mile & later
 part moderate winds and good weather
 Sat 3 - 55 N

Remarks on board Monday July 25th 1842
 the 24 hours barometer with moderate winds from the SSW
 bearing W at 12 saw breaches men for them but never saw
 them more saw one sail at a distance mile part strong winds
 later part the same
 Sat 4 - 07 N

Remarks on board Tuesday July 26th 1842
 the 24 hours barometer with strong winds from the SSW
 bearing W mile part moderate winds later part strong
 winds men in place at ship's duty
 Sat 4 - 34 N

Remarks on board Wednesday July 27th 1842
 the 24 hours barometer with strong winds from the S
 bearing WSW men in place at ship's duty mile & later
 part moderate winds saw porpoises
 Sat 4 - 55 N

Remarks on board Thursday July 28th 1842
 the 24 hours barometer with moderate winds from the SSW
 bearing SSW saw one sail at a distance mile & later part moderate
 winds saw porpoises & Co

Remarks on board Friday July 29th 1842
 the 24 hours barometer with moderate winds from the
 SSW bearing SSW mile part strong winds
 mile & later part moderate winds saw one sail at a distance
 no observation

Remarks on board Saturday July 30th 1842
 the 24 hours barometer with strong winds from the SSW
 bearing for whales spoke the ship. Charles W. Morgan of
 New Bedford Capt. Norton 11 miles out 360 fms mile & later
 part moderate winds saw plenty of porpoises
 no observation

Remarks on board Sunday July 31st 1842
 the 24 hours barometer with moderate winds from the SSW
 bearing W mile & later part moderate winds saw
 porpoises and plenty of birds
 Sat 4 - 24 N

Remarks on board Monday August 1st 1842
 the 24 hours barometer with moderate winds from the
 SSW bearing for whales mile and later part strong
 winds men in place at ship's duty
 Sat 4 - 56 N

Remarks on board Tuesday August 2nd 1842
 the 24 hours barometer with strong winds from the
 SSW took ship at 6 pm and held in shore mile part
 strong wind took in main top galant sail reef fore & main
 top sail at 10 pm main all sail with moderate winds
 Sat 4 - 29 N

Remarks on board Wednesday August 3rd 1842
 the 24 hours barometer with strong winds from the SSW
 mile & later part the same men in place at ship's
 duty
 no observation

Remarks on board Thursday August 4th 1842
 the 24 hours barometer with strong winds from the SSW
 bearing E mile & later part moderate winds got up the
 guns part of the men and cleaned them & Co
 Sat 2 - 32 N

Remarks on board Friday August 5th 1842
 the 24 hours barometer with moderate winds from the SSW
 bearing SSW mile part moderate winds later part the same
 men in place making rope & Co
 Sat 1 - 54 N
