The 24 hours commenced with light winds & calm sea small sail at 4 distance North side of Tahiti near passing N.E. dist. 8 leagues at 7 P.M. made & later part light trade wind in place at ship's entry

Remarks on board Sunday August 21 1842
The 24 hours commenced with light trade wind from S.E. bringing of rock under at 7 P.M. rock under bearing S.S.E. distance 3 leagues more ship at 8 and at 10 mile part in place at ship's entry later part the same spot the ship sailed of New Bedford Capt. Gilman out 34 months 1742 1842

Remarks on board Monday August 22 1842
The 24 hours commenced with moderate trade wind from the S.E. bringing of rock under close the ship. At about Capt. Richardson out 13 months 00 mile & later part strong trade wind saw humpbacks & Co.

Remarks on board Tuesday August 23 1842
The 24 hours commenced with moderate trade wind from the S.E. at 10 P.M. for ship's entry at dark rock under bearing S.S.E. distance 3 leagues more ship at 8 mile & later part moderate trade wind the watch in place making ship's entry

Remarks on board Wednesday August 24 1842
The 24 hours commenced with moderate trade wind from the S.E. beginning at 4 P.M. ship's entry at bearing S.S.E. distance 6 leagues more ship at 8 mile & later part moderate trade wind the watch in place making ship's entry

The 24 hours commenced with moderate trade wind from the S.E. beginning at 4 P.M. ship's entry at bearing S.W. distance 8 leagues more ship at 8 mile & later part strong trade wind the watch in place at ship's entry later part 00 mile
