 there are hours commences with moirait train's from the SE
 with pleasant weather cruising for whales spoke the
 ship George of Fair haven Capt Swift and supplied him
 with some small articles took in the light sails at dark
 at day light made all sail and with pleasant weather
 Sat 11 = 12 5

Remarks on board Monday October 31 1842
 there are hours commences with moirait train's from the SE
 and pleasant weather cruising for whales saw plenty of
 finbacks & porpoises made & later part moirait train's
 saw several sail at a distance men in employ at ships
 today Sat 4 = 02 5

Remarks on board Tuesday November 1 1842
 there are hours commences with moirait train's from the SE
 with pleasant weather saw finbacks porpoises & Co
 took in the light sail at dark made & later part moirait
 train's made all sail at day light
 Sat 3 = 13 5

Remarks on board Wednesday November 2 1842
 there are hours commences with moirait train's from the
 SE with fine weather saw finbacks took in the light
 sails at dark made light train's made all sail
 at day light ends with light train's the watch in employ
 at ships today Sat 2 = 10 5

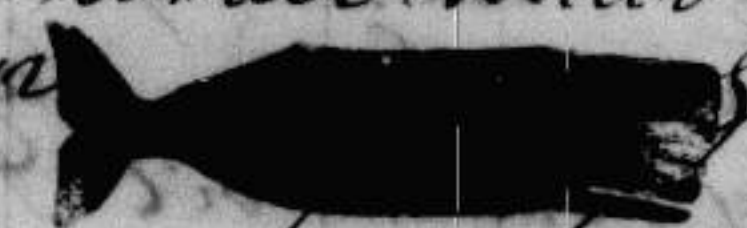
Remarks on board Thursday November 3 1842
 there are hours commences with light train's from the SE
 cruising for whales with pleasant weather saw finbacks
 & porpoises the watch in employ at ships today made
 & later part moirait train's saw one sail at a distance
 Sat 3 = 20 5

Remarks on board Friday November 4 1842
 there are hours commences with moirait train's from the SE
 with pleasant weather made & later part light train's
 spoke the ship Charles Capt Sherman 12 masts out 240 lbs
 the watch in employ making thimble for masts
 Sat 4 = 00 5

Remarks on board Saturday November 5 1842
 there are hours commences with light train's from the SE
 and fine weather Steaming off SE spoke the ship
 Merminia Smith of New Bedford Capt Brownell 34 masts 1650
 masts & later part moirait train's with light squalls
 of rain Sat 11 = 24 5

Remarks on board Sunday November 6 1842
 there are hours commences with moirait train's from the SE
 with light squalls of rain Steaming off SE at 3 o'clock
 took in the light sails at dark made & later part moirait
 train's saw finbacks Sat 4 = 53 5

Remarks on board Monday November 7 1842
 there are hours commences with moirait train's from the SE
 Steaming off SE saw took in the light sails at dark
 made & later part moirait train's the watch in employ
 at ships today Sat 4 = 43 5

Remarks on board Tuesday November 8 1842
 there are hours commences with moirait train's cruising for
 whales at 3 PM raised breaches at 4 o'clock with them
 and they seemed to be sperm whales bore at 4 1/2 struck
 and secured took him & long side took in sail & Co
 made part moirait train's bore all hands at day light and
 but in our whale main sail and beam it with the beam
 finished at 11  Sat 4 = 00 5 Long 113 1/2 ft

Remarks on board Wednesday November 9 1842
 there are hours commences with moirait train's from the SE
 and pleasant weather cruising for whales started the
 wires at 12 o'clock commenced boiling head made & later part
 broke train's all hands in employ boiling oil at 10 o'clock
 raised whales bore at 11 but did not secure & took of porpoises
 gales the whales came on board got finer & Co
 Sat 4 = 42 5 Long 113 1/2 ft

Remarks on board Thursday November 10 1842
 there are hours commences with moirait train's from the SE
 chasing whales with the ship bore at 1 PM struck and
 secured & took him of long side and but him in finished at
 6 1/2 made sail and started the watch made part moirait
 train's all hands in employ boiling oil at day light raised
 whales bore but did not secure came on board got finer and
 bore at 11 1/2 struck and secured one large whale took him & long side
 & Co
