

Remarks on board Wednesday December 21 1842
 there are hours commences with light trails from the S.E.
 and it being for whales seen porpoises black fish & or
 mink & later part light trails the watch employs mark
 ing spungam Lat 00 = 01 S

Remarks on board Thursday December 22 1842
 there are hours commences with light trails from the S.E.
 Steaming N.W. at dark took in the light sails and hauled
 mink & later part light trails semi-finished porpoises
 & by the watch employs marking spungam Lat 00 = 33 S

Remarks on board Friday December 23 1842
 there are hours commences with mid-vail trails from the S.E.
 Steaming N.W. at dark took in the light sails and hauled
 S.E. mink part mid-vail trails later part brisk trails
 and fine weather saw porpoises Lat 1 = 22 S

Remarks on board Saturday December 24 1842
 there are hours commences with brisk trails from the S.E.
 heaving S and fine weather saw porpoises & mink &
 later part mid-vail trails saw it ship standing to the
 N.E. & Eastward saw porpoises finbacks & C. Lat 2 = 55

Remarks on board Sunday December 25 1842
 there are hours commences with mid-vail trails from the S.E.
 and fine weather saw porpoises and bant one bill & log
 not hold and took in sail at dark and hauled to the
 Southward mink part mid-vail trails at day light main all
 sail taken ship and hauled N.W. ends with light
 trails and fine weather saw one pair of sperm but up
 Lat 3 = 25 S

Remarks on board Monday December 26 1842
 there are hours commences with light trails from the S.E. and fine
 weather took in sail at dark saw one sail at distance
 mink & later part mid-vail trails the watch employs at
 ship duty Lat 2 = 44 S

Remarks on board Tuesday December 27 1842
 there are hours commences with mid-vail trails from the
 S.E. and fine weather spoke the ship - Charles W. Morgan of
 New Bedford Capt Norton 15-2 mink out 900 lbs had seen
 whales 27 times in 3 mink mile & later part strong trails
 with light squalls of rain Lat 3 = 34 S

Remarks on board Wednesday December 28 1842
 there are hours commences with brisk trails and light squalls of rain
 the ship Charles W. Morgan in sight saw plenty of porpoises
 & finbacks ends with brisk trails and fine weather
 Lat 4 = 17 S

Remarks on board Thursday December 29 1842
 there are hours commences with mid-vail trails from the S.E.
 heaving S.E. saw one sail at distance took in the light
 sails at dark mink & later part mid-vail trails and fine weather
 at day light main all sail about the main top galant sail and
 mink shoked it and mink it Lat 4 = 58 S

Remarks on board Friday December 30 1842
 there are hours commences with mid-vail trails from the S.E. and
 fine weather the watch employs mink the main top galant sail
 at 2 P.M. but it at dark took in the light sails on S.E. & later
 part mid-vail trails Lat 3 = 56 S

Remarks on board Saturday December 31 1842
 there are hours commences with mid-vail trails and fine weather
 heaving to the N.E. & Eastward mink & later part mid-vail trails saw
 blackfish & porpoises the watch employs at ship duty
 Lat 3 = 00 S

Remarks on board Sunday January 1 1843
 there are hours commences with mid-vail trails and fine weather
 and it being for whales hild up the put out hole and
 bill & log for newspapers mink & later part mid-vail
 trails with light squalls of rain Lat 2 = 55 S

Remarks on board Monday January 2 1843
 there are hours commences with mid-vail trails from the S.E.
 and it being for whales the fore part attended with light squalls
 of rain mink & later part brisk trails Lat 3 = 42 S
