

Remarks on board Tuesday January 3 1843

At 10 hours commenced with brisk trade from the S.E. steaming
of Hancock 35 miles out 1400 spoke the ship Hancock
of Newport Capt. Winthrop 18 miles out 4500 lbs
the watch employed during the hour steers

Lat 2 42 S

Remarks on board Wednesday January 4 1843
At 10 hours commenced with strong trade and fine weather
bore N.W. at dark double reef and light upon the wind
to the S. mile past brisk trade at day light bore of W. and
S.E. on the far side and commenced steaming at
ends with strong trade

Lat 3 11 S

Remarks on board Thursday January 5 1843

At 10 hours commenced with strong trade from the S.E. and
steaming for whales took in sail at dark and heeled
S. finish mending the fore top sail and bent at mile
S. later part brisk trade at day light bore of W. and
S.E. ends the 10 hours

Lat 3 21 S

Remarks on board Friday January 6 1843
At 10 hours commenced with strong trade and fine weather
steaming N.W. took in sail at dark and light upon the wind
to the South at day light main sail and steamed off the watch
employed at ship's duty Lat 3 24 S

Remarks on board Saturday January 7 1843
At 10 hours commenced with brisk trade from the S. steaming
off at 1 P.M. the bore N.W. at dark double reef the
top sails mired & later part moderate trade at night with
squalls of rain Lat 2 22 S

Remarks on board Sunday January 8 1843
At 10 hours commenced with moderate trade from the S.E. steaming
off at dark and heeled on the wind to the S. & East
more at day light bore of S. ends with moderate trade
with light squalls of rain

Lat 1 10 S

Remarks on board Monday January 9 1843
At 10 hours commenced with moderate trade from the S.E.
steaming off at dark and heeled on the wind to the S. & East
more at day light main sail and steamed
W. ends with brisk trade and good weather

Lat 00 44 S

Remarks on board Tuesday January 10 1843

At 10 hours commenced with brisk trade from the S.E. steaming
off at 1 P.M. the bore N.W. at day light bore
S. sail spoke the ship Callaghan of Portland Capt.
Gorance 42 miles out 200 ends with brisk trade

Lat 00 25 S

Remarks on board Wednesday January 11 1843
At 10 hours commenced with moderate trade from the S.E.
and steaming for whales steaming off to N.W. 12
miles past light squalls of rain spoke ship Reiger of
New Bedford Capt. West 17 miles out 200 and so ends the 10
hours in company with the Callaghan 18 observation

Remarks on board Thursday January 12 1843

At 10 hours commenced with brisk trade from the S.E.
steaming N.W. in company with the Callaghan of
Portland at 6 P.M. spoke the ship Dryden of S. P. O. Capt.
Hamm's 17 miles out 350 lbs mile & later part
brisk trade Lat 00 14 S

Remarks on board Friday January 13 1843
At 10 hours commenced with brisk trade and fine weather
at 2 P.M. the bore N.W. steamed for whales at 6
P.M. more ship and steamed S.W. mile & later part strong
trade saw one seal at distance

Lat 00 24 S

Remarks on board Saturday January 14 1843
At 10 hours commenced with strong trade from the S.E. and
mending the watch employed mending sewing stuff mile & later
part moderate trade saw one finback at 7 A.M. more
ship and steamed N.W. Lat 00 57 S

Remarks on board Sunday January 15 1843
At 10 hours commenced with moderate trade and fine weather
bore N.W. the watch employed at ship's duty hit hole & 6
mile & later part moderate trade and fine weather
saw black fish Lat 00 25 N

Remarks on board Monday January 16 1843
At 10 hours commenced with brisk trade and fine weather
bore N.W. took in the light sails at dark mile & later
part moderate trade the watch employed steaming in the
wise region Lat 00 06 N
