 the 24 hours bonussers with light trails from the N.E. all hands
 employe storing grain spoke the Barque Lexington
 of Providence Capt. Lane 14 masts out 250 lbs
 stow down 120 lbs and had for the night for the oil to cool
 untill Monday. Lat 1-35 S

Remarks onboard Sunday March 12 1843
 the 24 hours bonussers with light trails from the N.E.
 the watch employe at ships duty the Cooper employe
 repairing basket mule & later part light trails saw
 porpoises & humpers. Lat 1-14 S

Remarks onboard Monday March 13 1843
 the 24 hours bonussers with light trails from the N.E.
 and fine weather cruising for whales saw porpoises
 spoke the Barque Lexington of Providence Capt.
 Lane 14 masts out 200 lbs & 600 lb bonnet
 storing grain oil stow down 37 lbs and fished at 12
 and 10 o'clock the 24 hours. Lat 00-58 S

Remarks onboard Tuesday March 14 1843
 the 24 hours bonussers with light trails from the N.E.
 and of cruising for whales saw small breaches and porpoises
 mule & later part calm on board the ship and mule at
 Lat 1-14 S

Remarks onboard Wednesday March 15 1843
 the 24 hours bonussers with calm weather the watch
 employe mending the sub bent it at 4 Pm none ship
 and hauled S.E. S.E. at 6 Pm mule & later part
 light trails. Lat 1-21 S

Remarks onboard Thursday March 16 1843
 the 24 hours bonussers with light trails and fine weather
 turned up the station boat and painted it at 5 Pm
 saw breaches mule & later part mule trails the
 watch employe at ships duty. Lat 00-10 S

Remarks onboard Friday March 17 1843
 the 24 hours bonussers with mule trails from the
 N.E. at 6 Pm hooked ship and hauled S.E. S.E. mule &
 later part brisk trails turned up the labor boat and
 painted it. Lat 00-27 S

Remarks onboard Saturday March 18 1843
 the 24 hours bonussers with brisk trails from the N.E.
 and fine weather the watch employe at ships duty mule &
 later part brisk trails on board the ship and mule at
 had the top sails sheets & c. Lat 1-35 S

Remarks onboard Sunday March 19 1843
 the 24 hours bonussers with brisk trails and fine weather
 having S.E. S.E. the watch employe at ships duty mule &
 later part mule trails. Lat 2-01 S Long 174-05 S

Remarks onboard Monday March 20 1843
 the 24 hours bonussers with mule trails from the
 N.E. having N.E. S.E. at 2 Pm raised whales com at 4 struck
 and hauled one took him at long side and bonnet cutting
 the hulk tore out we bashed down mule sail and hauled the
 whale all night at day light but in the whale mule sail
 and bonnet cutting. Lat 1-35 S

Remarks onboard Tuesday March 21 1843
 the 24 hours bonussers with mule trails with light
 squalls of rain all hands employe boiling oil fished at 3
 Pm mule at day light 20 lbs with mule trails
 and fine weather. Lat 1-27 S

Remarks onboard Wednesday March 22 1843
 the 24 hours bonussers with mule trails and fine weather
 having at the watch employe at ships duty mule & later
 part mule trails on board the main top galant sail
 and bonnet mending at Lat 1-52 S

Remarks onboard Thursday March 23 1843
 the 24 hours bonussers with brisk trails from the N.E.
 hooked ship at 6 Pm mule at 12 bent the main top galant
 sail & c. mule & later part mule trails. Lat 1-12 S

Remarks onboard Friday March 24 1843
 the 24 hours bonussers with mule trails and fine weather
 at 3 Pm saw the isle of Sandwich having S.E. S.E. distance 6
 leagues hooked ship at 6 Pm and hauled S.E. S.E. hooked at 12
 saw the land at 10 Pm saw breaches. Lat 00-59 S
