

Remarks on board Saturday March 25th 1843

the 24 hours commenced with moderate trade and fine weather
 dropped ship at 2 PM and hauled SBC side in harbor
 hauled. A distance of 4 leagues at 6 PM middle of later part
 light trade the watch employed at ship's duty
 Lat 1-45 S

Remarks on board Sunday March 26th 1843

the 24 hours commenced with light trade and fine
 weather with hole & Co. packed ship at 6 PM and hauled
 SBC but saw chain fore tacks middle & later part
 moderate trade saw sail at distance
 Lat 1-25 S

Remarks on board Monday March 27th 1843

the 24 hours commenced with light trade and fine weather
 spoke the ship Sana of Fair Haven Capt. Jones
 19 months ago 1000 lbs. middle & later part moderate trade
 set up the labor side of the fore rig and the fore
 & aft stais
 Lat 1-25 S

Remarks on board Tuesday March 28th 1843

the 24 hours commenced with light trade & fine weather
 the watch employed taking rig spoke ship Sana of Fair Haven
 Capt. Jones 19 months ago 1000 lbs. middle & later part
 light on the wind at dark middle & later part moderate
 trade
 Lat 00-42 S

Remarks on board Wednesday March 29th 1843

the 24 hours commenced with moderate trade and fine
 weather with ship at 11 and hauled SBC the watch employed
 at ship's duty took in sail at dark middle & later part
 calm
 Lat 00-45 S

Remarks on board Thursday March 30th 1843

the 24 hours commenced with calm weather at 1 PM saw
 blackish bird but did not strike took in sail at 4 PM
 middle & later part moderate trade of very light
 by 4 PM the watch employed stripping the
 cutting blocks
 Lat 00-35 S

Remarks on board Friday March 31st 1843

the 24 hours commenced with moderate trade and fine
 weather took in the light sails at dark and light to
 the wind middle & later moderate trade
 Lat 00-45 S

Remarks on board Saturday April 1st 1843

the 24 hours commenced with moderate trade and blowing
 weather spoke the ship Sana of Fair Haven Capt. Lane 19 months
 out with at 2 PM saw Ocean Island fairing 11 PM distance
 4 leagues middle part strong trade at daylight top of and
 sun down under the lee of the island and later sun became
 for ends with strong trade bore 17 PM

Remarks on board Sunday April 2nd 1843

the 24 hours commenced with strong trade and fine weather
 steaming SBC took in sail at dark and hauled SBC night
 at daylight main sail and steam 5 PM ends with
 moderate trade
 Lat 00-20 S

Remarks on board Monday April 3rd 1843

the 24 hours commenced with moderate trade and fine weather
 steaming SBC took in the light sails at dark and
 at 5 PM saw pleasant island bearing S 11 W distance 5 leagues
 saw ship at 1 PM at day light top of and sun under the lee
 of pleasant island but it was maintained for

Remarks on board Tuesday April 4th 1843

the 24 hours commenced with moderate trade and fine weather
 discharged the canvas at 3 PM and hauled SBC spoke the
 ship Sana of Fair Haven Capt. Jones middle & later part
 broke trade set in the spoke the Columbia of Mashpee
 Capt. Day 19 months out 900 lbs. but it was fore top
 mast staved
 Lat 00-53 N

Remarks on board Wednesday April 5th 1843

the 24 hours commenced with moderate trade and
 fine weather and company with with Columbia
 of Sana at 4 PM raised one lone ribale down and
 struck and parted the line took in sail at dark tacked
 ship at 1 PM later part moderate trade and fine
 weather
 Lat 1-37 N

Remarks on board Thursday April 6th 1843

the 24 hours commenced with moderate trade and fine
 weather saw too sail at distance bore 1 PM 11 PM
 middle & later part moderate trade spoke the ship
 Columbia of Sana & the ship Sana of Fair Haven
 Lat 3-05 N
