 the 24 hours barometer with moderate rain and fine
 weather took the light sails at dawn and steamed N^W 1/2
 by wind N^W 1/2 mile & later part moderate rain
 State down 20 lbs of oil got out some shovels for water
 & for
 Sat 4 - 10 A

Remarks on board Saturday April ^{the} 12 1843
 the 24 hours barometer with light rain and light squalls
 of rain the watch employed at ship's duty middle &
 later part strong rain & squalls, scraping the
 stanchions side & ship at distance
 Sat 5 - 13 A

Remarks on board Sunday April ^{the} 13 1843
 the 24 hours barometer with strong rain and clear weather
 spoke the ship Para of Fairbairn Capt. James 20 miles
 out 900 lbs saw the ship Columbia at distance
 not held & for took in the main sail at dusk and hauled to
 the 1/2 & 1/2 and all night middle part moderate rain
 shook out the rugs at daylight and steamed N^W 1/2
 Sat 6 - 25 A

Remarks on board Monday April ^{the} 14 1843
 the 24 hours barometer with strong rain and misty
 weather steaming N^W 1/2 in company with the
 ship Para of Fairbairn Capt. James took in sail at dusk
 and lay with the mainyard & back all night at daylight
 main sail and steamed N^W later part moderate rain
 the watch employed setting up shovels and other work
 set up 6 pipes
 Sat 6 - 23 A
 Long 1 58 56

Remarks on board Tuesday April ^{the} 15 1843
 the 24 hours barometer with moderate rain and fine
 weather at 2 PM saw Wellington's island bearing N^W 1/2
 distance 6 leagues at 2 PM saw 1/2 miles low but distant
 strike took in sail at dusk and lay with the mainyard
 & back middle & later part moderate rain main sail
 at daylight and steamed N^W
 Sat 6 - 24 A

Remarks on board Wednesday April ^{the} 16 1843
 the 24 hours barometer with light rain and fine weather
 at 2 PM saw Ascension island bearing N^W 1/2
 distance 6 leagues lay of and on all night at daylight main sail
 and on 10 PM Ascension island bore to anchor in 19 fathoms of water
 at 1 PM

Remarks on board Thursday April ^{the} 17 1843
 the 24 hours barometer with moderate rain and fine weather
 at 2 PM sent a boat to shore with 1 raft the others
 employed on board of the ship middle & later part calm

Remarks on board Friday April ^{the} 18 1843
 the 24 hours barometer with calm weather all hands employed
 washing and scraping ship at 4 PM Cornet putting
 ship and sent boat his full water back of our raft and 6 ends
 the 24 hours

Remarks on board Saturday April ^{the} 19 1843
 the 24 hours barometer with moderate rain and all hands
 employed painting ship and getting water middle & later part
 moderate rain

Remarks on board Sunday April ^{the} 20 1843
 the 24 hours barometer with moderate rain and light squalls
 of rain middle & later part the same

Remarks on board Monday April ^{the} 21 1843
 the 24 hours barometer with moderate rain and steady with
 light squalls of rain sent one watch on liberty and the other
 employed painting ship

Remarks on board Tuesday April ^{the} 22 1843
 the 24 hours barometer with squally weather and plenty of rain
 one watch on liberty the other on ship's duty at 2 PM
 set go the starboard anchor and with plenty of rain

Remarks on board Wednesday April ^{the} 23 1843
 the 24 hours barometer with squally weather and plenty of rain
 one watch on liberty took on board 1 boat load of wood
 and stowed it at way & for

 the other on ship's duty middle & later part
 rainy weather

Remarks on board Friday April ^{the} 25 1843
 all of the 24 hours plenty of rain one watch on liberty and
 one on ship's duty took on board 1 boat load of wood
