

Remarks on board Sunday May 7th 1843
The as 24 hours commences with light winds and fine weather
at 1 Pm the boats came in and all things being on board
we proceeded to sea made 8 later part moderate winds
at 4 Am saw Tunisian island bearing E distance
10 leagues No observation thus 24 hours

Remarks on board Monday May 8th 1843
The as 24 hours commences with light winds and fine weather
Spoke the barque Pearl of Siforan 10 munts out 100 lbs
made 8 later part moderate winds and fine weather
Sat 17 = 40 N

Remarks on board Tuesday May 9th 1843
The as 24 hours commences with moderate winds at midnight
with light squalls of rain saw a sail at E distance
made 8 later part moderate wind Steaming N B W
the watch employed at ship's duty
Sat 19 = 22 N

Remarks on board Wednesday May 10th 1843
The as 24 hours commences with brisk winds with light
squalls of rain saw a sail at E distance bore
N B W made 8 later part moderate winds took in the
bow boat & painted it Sat 21 = 24 N

Remarks on board Thursday May 11th 1843
The as 24 hours commences with moderate winds and fine
weather blacked the anchors & 6 or made 8 later part
moderate winds and fine weather made a new maintop
galant stay & 6 or Sat 23 = 36 N

Remarks on board Friday May 12th 1843
The as 24 hours commences with moderate winds and fine
weather Steaming N B W the watch employed at ship's
duty made 8 later part light wind the later part
of the as 24 hours steamed N B W
Sat 25 = 13 N

Remarks on board Saturday May 13th 1843
The as 24 hours commences with light winds from the East more
steaming N B W with a heavy swell from the Northward
made 8 later part light wind's
Sat 26 = 20 N

Remarks on board Sunday May 14th 1843
The as 24 hours commences with light winds from the N E
and fine weather saw five packets took in the light
sails at dark made 8 later part light wind's saw
grampses Sat 27 = 32 N

Remarks on board Monday May 15th 1843
The as 24 hours commences with light wind from the Eastward
heaving to the Northward took the light sails in at dark
made 8 later part calm on board the fore top sail and sent
up the phone on board the fore top galant sail and sent
it to the main Sat 28 = 00 N

Remarks on board Tuesday May 16th 1843
The as 24 hours commences with calms and clear weather
the watch employed mending the maintop galant sail
took a light breeze from the S W at 3 Pm and steamed
N B W took in the light sail at dark made 8 later part
calm later part light breeze sent up a new main
top galant stay Sat 29 = 20 N

Remarks on board Wednesday May 17th 1843
The as 24 hours commences with light squalls from the
Westward the watch employed at ship's duty made 8 later
part light wind and fine weather saw several packets
of squids saw one barque at E distance
Sat 29 = 04 N

Remarks on board Thursday May 18th 1843
The as 24 hours commences with moderate winds from the
N E heaving N B W spoke the barque Pearl of
Siforan Capt Blankingshew 10 munts out 100 lbs
took in sail at dark made 8 later part squalls of rain
at 4 Am it lighted up set the dib & spancher at 9
shook the reefs out of the maintop sail and set the main
sail at 11 Am the wind shifted to S W squared the yards
and steamed E Sat 29 = 42 N

Remarks on board Friday May 19th 1843
The as 24 hours commences with moderate winds and with light
squalls of rain Steaming E took in sail at dark and put on the
wind made 8 later part strong breezes set fore & main
top sails dib & spancher and main sail
Sat 29 = 24 N
