Remarks on board Tuesday August 1 1843
The as 24 hours commenced with light airs from the N.W.
and fine weather all hands employed setting up pipes
shortened sail at dark middle & later part light airs
from all parts of the compass
Lat 29-47 N

Remarks on board Wednesday August 2 1843
The as 24 hours commenced with light airs from all parts
of the compass the watch employed cooking oil
shortened sail at dark middle part calm at day
light commenced stowing down oil at 1 P.M. saw
whales were at 12 struck and killed one weighing
and shared the rest and so ends the as 24 hours
No observation

Remarks on board Thursday August 3 1843
The as 24 hours commenced with calm weather all hands
employed cruising whales at 3 P.M. struck and
killed one took him to the ship at dark shortened sail
of 6 at 5 P.M. commenced butting finished at 10 1/2 P.M.
blew it away the heads of 8 & 6 Lat 29-36 N Long 156-20 E

Remarks on board Friday August 4 1843
The as 24 hours commenced with light airs from the
the westward all hands employed boiling oil and
stowing down oil spoke the Syria of New York
3 1/2 hours out 1450 lbs Lat 29-50 N

Remarks on board Saturday August 5 1843
The as 24 hours commenced with moderate breezes from
the S.W. and fine weather all hands employed boiling
oil and setting shooks middle & later part strong gales
and squalls of rain saw one sail at distance
Lat 29-57 N

Remarks on board Sunday August 6 1843
The as 24 hours commenced with strong gales and squalls
weather all hands employed boiling oil & 2 mile
part strong gales and plenty of rain finished boiling
at 12 P.M. at daylight wet hole and commenced setting
up shooks and so ends the as 24 hours
Lat 29-59 N

Remarks on board Monday August 7 1843
The as 24 hours commenced with moderate winds from the
S.W. and a heavy swell cruising for whales all hands
employed setting up shooks and cooking oil middle &
later part moderate winds with light squalls of rain
at day light commenced stowing down oil and so ends the
as 24 hours Lat 30-00 N

Remarks on board Tuesday August 8 1843
The as 24 hours commenced with moderate winds from the
S.E. and a heavy swell all hands employed stowing down
oil stoke down 59 bbls and chooked of the fore hold
shortened sail at dark middle & later part moderate wind
and cloudy weather at 7 P.M. broke out and stoke 4 pipes
in between decks took up sun water & 8
Lat 30-00 N

Remarks on board Wednesday August 9 1843
The as 24 hours commenced with moderate breezes from
the S.W. with blowing rain sun rain washed of
8 & 6 shortened sail at dark middle & later part moderate
winds and plenty of rain No observation
