

Remarks on board Monday August ^{the} 21 1843

These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the S.E. and fine weather at 4 P.M. tacked ship and hauled N.W. 1/2 mile part moderate winds at 12 P.M. tacked ship and hauled S.W. the watch employe at ship's duty
Lat 30° 07' N Long 166° 24' W

Remarks on board Tuesday August ^{the} 22 1843
These 24 hours commences with moderate winds from the S.W. and fine weather at 3 P.M. saw whales leaved at 4 struck and saw 3 took them too the ship and got ready for cutting middle part fine weather at day light commenced cutting at 4 A.M. raised whales leaved and chased but could not strike came onboard and went to cutting spoke the ship hauled of hauled out 1000 lbs cut in 2 whales and the third one head and then got dinner at 12 saw more whales leaved struck and saw 2 took them too the ship started the work at 3 P.M. middle part strong winds and squalls of rain later part moderate winds and fine weather all hands employe boiling oil cutting in & setting up shooves cut in 3 heads and got dinner no observation

Remarks on board Wednesday August ^{the} 23 1843
These 24 hours commences with moderate winds from the eastward all hands employe cutting in whales boiling oil and setting up shooves saw one ship at a distance boiling

Remarks on board Thursday August ^{the} 24 1843
These 24 hours commences with moderate winds from the S.W. and fine weather all hands employe boiling oil setting up shooves and cutting in a mile part moderate winds and fine weather
No observation

Remarks on board Friday August ^{the} 25 1843
These 24 hours commences with calm weather all hands employe boiling oil but in 2 heads and cleaned them at day middle & later part calm and fine weather
Lat 30° 16' N

Remarks on board Saturday August ^{the} 26 1843

These 24 hours commences with fine weather and calm all hands employe boiling oil finished at 12 P.M. at day light commenced stowing iron and 50 cwt thus 24 hours all hands employe stowing iron
Lat 30° 09' N

Remarks on board Sunday August ^{the} 27 1843
These 24 hours commences with moderate winds from the S.W. steaming S.W. and fine weather all hands employe stowing iron oil middle & later part moderate winds and fine weather
Lat 29° 49' N

Remarks on board Monday August ^{the} 28 1843
These 24 hours commences with light winds from the S.W. and fine weather all hands employe stowing iron oil at 6 P.M. tacked ship and hauled N.W. 1/2 mile & later part moderate winds and fine weather all hands employe at ship's duty saw one sail at a distance
Lat 30° 15' N

Remarks on board Tuesday August ^{the} 29 1843
These 24 hours commences with moderate winds from the S.W. and fine weather the watch employe at ship's duty middle part brisk winds and blizzard weather later part strong winds from the S.W. and saw rain saw breachers at 10 A.M. double reef the top sails
Lat 30° 42' N

Remarks on board Wednesday August ^{the} 30 1843
These 24 hours commences with strong winds from the S.W. and plenty of rain saw 2 sail at a distance hope to under blast reef main top sail fore top must stay sail and main spussers middle & later part strong gales and rainy weather
No observation

Remarks on board Thursday August ^{the} 31 1843
These 24 hours commences with strong gales from the S.W. and plenty of rain cruising under blast reef top sails fore the fore sail at 1/2 mile & later part strong winds set double reef top sail at day light saw 2 sail at a distance sent new footropes on the deck beam
