these 24 hours commences with moderate trade and
cloudy weather all hands employ'd painting spars &c
at 4 PM ball all hands and hose shot at 5 the pilot
came on board, raised anchor and tie in to the harbor
and moved got it raft ready got down &c

Remarks on board Saturday October 21st 1843
these 24 hours commences with light breeze and fine weather
all hands employ'd getting water and painting ship
at 7 AM sent the stokers watch on liberty and the
then at ships duty paint ship

Remarks on board Sunday October 22nd 1843
these 24 hours commences with good weather one watch
on liberty middle & later part the same

Remarks on board Monday October 23rd 1843
these 24 hours commences with fine weather one watch
on liberty and the other painting ship

Remarks on board Tuesday October 24th 1843
these 24 hours commences with fine weather one watch
on liberty and the other painting ship

Remarks on board Wednesday October 25th 1843
these 24 hours commences with fine weather one watch
on liberty middle & later part fine weather

these 24 hours commences with moderate weather
one watch on liberty and the other at ships
duty

these 24 hours commences with fine weather
one watch on liberty and the other on ships duty

Remarks on board Saturday October 28th 1843
these 24 hours commences fine weather with one
watch on liberty and the other on ships duty

Remarks on board Sunday October 29th 1843
these 24 hours commences with fine weather sent
all hands to meeting

Remarks on board Monday October 30th 1843
these 24 hours commences with fine weather all
hands employ'd getting water and potatoes

Remarks on board Tuesday October 31st 1843
these 24 hours commences with fine weather all hands
employ'd getting ready for sea

Remarks on board Wednesday November 1st 1843
these 24 hours commences with fine weather at 4 PM
took our anchor and all things being ready we went
to sea at 11 discharged the pilot and with fine weather
all hands employ'd stow anchors &c

Remarks on board Thursday November 2nd 1843
these 24 hours commences with moderate winds and
fine weather running down the coast at 5 PM left
on the wind to the N^W mile & later part strong
trade from the N^W got 22 57 AM

Remarks on board Friday November 3rd 1843
these 24 hours commences with strong trade from the
N^W heading N^W by S saw 1 sail at a distance
middle & later part strong trade the watch employ'd
at ships duty got 24 47 AM

Remarks on board Saturday November 4th 1843
these 24 hours commences with strong trade from the
N^W heading N^W by S under double reef top sails
and courses middle & later part strong winds with
squalls of rain got 26 17 AM

Remarks on board Sunday November 5th 1843
these 24 hours commences with strong gales from the
N^W heading N^W by S at 3 PM took in the jib
at 4 took in the main sail middle part strong gale
at 11 AM set the jib and shook 1 reef out of the top
sails and set the main sail got 27 19 AM

Remarks on board Monday November 6th 1843
these 24 hours commences with moderate winds with a
heavy swell and fine weather set fore & main top gales
sails saw 1 sail at a distance middle & later part
light variable got 28 42 AM
