


Tuesday the 6th June 1832

These 24 hours fine weather with light winds Saw a large School of blackfish Steering NW Ends these 24 hours

Low By Chron 179°40'30" East
Low By  179°43'30" " Latt By Obs 17°57' N

Thursday the 7th June

This day light air and calm Saw a School of porpoises and other coves Ends
Low By Chron 179°02' East Latt By Obs 19°36' N

Friday the 8th June

These 24 hours commences and continues with light breeze from the SE Steering NW with a Swell from the North

Low By Obs By Chron 178°30'30" West E
Latt By Obs 20°08'

Saturday the 9th June

This day fine weather wind from NE to SE Steering North with a bad Swell from the North Latt 21°55' N

Low By Chron 178°27'30" East

Sunday the 10th June

This day light variable winds from SE to NW Steering to the North Saw porpoises
Low By Chron 178°41'30" East

Latt By Obs 23°00' N

Monday the 11th June

This day Begins fine breeze a Squall from the SE Latter a fine SE Steering to the N By W Saw Jumpers
Low By Chron 178°31'15" E Latt 24°10' N

Tuesday the 12th June 1832

All this day fine weather Wind NE heading to the North Saw Birds

Low By Chron 178°34' E Latt 25°20' N

Wednesday the 13th June

All this day Saw nothing Wind NE SE heading to the NNW


Low By Chron 177°51' E Latt 27°13' N

Thursday the 14th June

All this day thick and rainy from the ENE heading North

Low By Chron 177°07' E Latt 29°25' N

Friday the 15th

This day fine weather at 6 AM Saw a School of large whales put off struck one took him to the Ship Blot Stove
Low 177°15' E  34 whale

Saturday the 16th June

These 24 hours fine weather at 10 AM fine led getting made Sail Wind SE heading to the Westward Latt By Obs 30°42' North

Sunday the 17th June 1832

These 24 hours commences with thick rainy weather with variable winds Saw porpoises Birds &c at 8 AM Cooled down the Works at 2 PM but the fire commences boiling the lead Ends with muggy weather and rain

No Obs Sun Observed.
