Commenced with light airs from the East
at 7 Am Calm Tides with light baffling
and sea calm

Friday Nov 9th
Commenced calm Empirical setting
up the main rigging throughout these
24 hours light airs and calms Empirical
setting up new rigging

Long 28.50 W

Saturday Nov 10th
Commenced calm at 5 Am took
a light breeze from the Northwest
Course S by E at 7 Am Tides with
fresh breeze from N.E. Course S by E
Lat 30.40 N
Long 27.49 W

Sunday Nov 11th
Commenced with fresh breeze and
fine from N.E. Course S by E all sail
Tides with fresh breeze and squally
from E Course S all sail
Lat 28.22 N
Long 26.35 W

Monday Nov 12th
Commenced with fresh breeze and
squally and fine rain Course S all
sail Tides with fresh breeze and
fine rain squalls from E by E
Course S all sail Empirical at
various parts of ships elute

from E by E all sail Course S by E
and latter fresh breeze and squally

weather Course S by W all sail throughout
these 24 hours the same on sail in light
Lat 19.34 N
Long 25.23 W

Thursday Nov 15th
Commenced with fresh breeze and fine
weather Course S by S all sail all day light
at entrance in light to windward 5 miles
off Tides with light breeze and fine weather
Lat 16.53 N
Long

Friday Nov 16th
Commenced light breeze and fine
weather Course S by W all sail
Tides with light breeze and fine weather
Empirical on the rigging
Lat 14.05 N
Long 26.00 W

Saturday Nov 17th
Commenced light airs and calm
breeze and latter light airs and
fine weather Course S by W all sail
Lat 14.05 N
