with the Schooner Agate of Provincetown

Commenced light trades and hazy
Saw Blackfish took 2 Middle and
latter half

Commenced Calm Beiled out the
Blackfish Tords with heavy rain

Commenced with rain squalls and
calms Middle heavy squalls with heavy
rain Enges moderate and calm

Commenced Calm Middle light aze
from S.E. all sail Course S by S Enges
with light breeze and hazy from S.E.
all sail Course the same
Lat 3.56 N
Long 24.11 W

Monday Nov 26th
Commenced with fresh S.E. trades and
hazy weather Course S by S and S W
all sail 2 sails in light Enges with
fresh trades Enges low Coasting Breeds
and latter Course S W all sail
Lat 1.36 N
Long

Tuesday Nov 27th
Commenced with fresh trades and hazy
weather Course S W by S all sail Enges
with fresh trades and fine weather
Course S W all sail Lat 1.23 S
Long 27.28 W

Wednesday Nov 28th
Commenced with fresh S.E. trades
and fine weather Course S W all sail
Throughout the 24 hours fresh trades
and fine weather completed at sunrise
got new main top sail braces
main jacks and sheets Course S W
by S all sail Lat 4.31 S
Long 28.57 W
