Middle light - drizzling rain ends
with Squalls commenced stormy down

Tuesday - Dec 11th
Commenced raining finished
stormy down 72 lbs wine at N
Course S.W. S. Easy sail Middle
thick Ends raining No Obs

Wednesday Dec 12th
Commenced calm and raining
Middle raining Ends fine weather
from N.W. S. Course S.W. all
Sail
Lat 24.39 S
Long 37.59 W

Thursday Dec 13th
Commenced with thick and
raining from N.W. S. Course S.W.
Ends thick and Hazy saw
Sperm Whale took one got it
to the ship at sundown

Commenced with thick Hazy from
N.W. Sperm Whale busting and clearing
away all ready for Boiling at
midnight Halted the Works thick
weather with fine rain Ends Hazy

Commenced with foggy weather
from S.W. Sperm Whale Boiling Middle and
Latter foggy Squalls and fine rain

Sunday Dec 16th
Commenced with fresh and light
breeze from S. to S.W. Course S.W. Sperm
Whale and fine rain Ends with
light breeze and fine weather
from N. to N.W. S. Course S.W.
Lat 28.01 S
Long 43.16 W

Monday Dec 17th
Commenced with light breezes
and fine weather from N.W. S.
Course S.W. all sail Ends from
Sperm Whale stormy down the last air
20 lbs

Tuesday Dec 18th
Commenced with fresh breezes
and squally from S.W. to the mid
Oposite 2 a/c. Ends with a fresh
Sail from S.W. to the wind Oposite
Sack. Oposite 2 a/c. Sperm Whale
