Saturday Jan 12th
Commenced with strong breeze
and fine clear weather from S.W.
Law a great inquiry perceived
Came with light airs and calms

Sunday Jan 13th
Commenced calm and heavy
swell veering from N.W. by W
Middle light airs came with a
fresh breeze and heavy weather
from N heading to the Westward
No Obs

Monday Jan 14th
Commenced with strong breeze
and thick heavy fog from E by S
Middle fresh sails from E ends
fresh sails and running close
reefed fore sails heading to the Westward
Lat 38.16 S
Long 48.19 W
