and fine weather from NW breeze
S.W. Boiling Middle the same ends
with fresh Breezes and fine weather
from the N. Employed Boiling

Sunday Feb 3rd
Commenced with strong breezes
and varied weather from N. Breeze
Jacks by the wind sheet sail
Middle fine weather and calm
and foggy

Monday Feb 4th
Commenced foggy and fine
rain Middle calm and foggy
ends fine weather and light
breezes from S.W. Employed stowing
down

Tuesday Feb 5th
Fine weather and light breezes
from S.W. finished stowing about 10
o'clock Ends with strong breezes and
bad thick weather from NW

Wednesday Feb 6th
Commenced heavy foggy from
N.W. Ends with strong breezes
and fine weather Employed a
Mushing ship Saw a sail heading
to the S.W.
Lat 44.00 S
Long 57.07 W

Thursday Feb 7th 1878
Commenced with strong breezes
and fine weather from NW by the
wind Oposite Jacks Ends with fresh
breezes and heavy weather from the
Westward Employed repairing the Bow
Bolt with other jobs

Friday Feb 8th
Commenced with heavy weather
from W by the wind Oposite Jacks
Ends with fine weather from S to
S.W.
Lat 45.08 S
Long 58.18 W

Saturday Feb 9th
Commenced with fresh breezes and
fine weather from S.W. Oposite Jacks
by the wind Employed repairing Boat
Ends with strong breezes from the
N.W. and a heavy swell running
from W

Sunday Feb 10th
Commenced with fresh S.W. from
N.W. Ends with strong breezes
and veering to N and N.E. by the
wind Oposite Jacks about 10 o'clock
Top Sails
Lat 44.01 S
Long 57.59 W
