Saturday Mch 2nd 1878
Commenced with light squally
air at 5:30 Am. Saw 3 seals
Whales going quick to NW corner
4 Boats started to Dube
Copes with fresh Sails and
balding took in all sail the
weather looking bad and the
barometer low and unsettled

Sunday Mch 3rd
Commenced with squally
at 7 Am better weather wind
W. Set Double reefed Top Sails
fifth & courses by the main to the
S. Enes with light Boreses from
N and N.W.

Long 55.27 W

Monday Mch 4th
Commenced with light Boreses
and fine weather wind veering
to S.W. S. and S.E. Course S.W.
by S all sail saw a great many
finbacks Under fine weather bent
a new Fur Top Sail

Tuesday Mch 5th
Commenced with fine weather
and light Boreses from N to
N.W. Course S.W. by W employed
Reparing the Old Fur Top Sail
Middle Squally Enes with a thick
thick fog and fresh Boreses from
N.W. Course S.W.
No Obs

Wednesday Mch 6th 1878
Commenced with foggy at 2 cleared
up light Boreses from W. by W. Course
S.W. Middle the same Enes with light
Boreses from N.E. Course S.W. by W all
Sail employed at various jobs

Thursday Mch 7th
Put a man in Irons for
fighting and taking a knife
put him in the Run his name
Commenced with light Boreses and
fine weather from N.E. Course
S.W. by W. Saw new Fur Boreses
Middle light air foggy and fine
rain Enes with thick foggy with
light air from W. by W. to N
No Obs

Friday Mch 8th
Commenced with a Sunday Storm
took in all sail weather looking bad
wind hauling to S.W. at 3:30 Am made
Sail double reefed Top Sails at 7 Set
Top Sails my sail in light at 8
Wind S.E. bearing up. Heavy Storm
Sail again at 9 fresh sail at midday
aghting sail and a heavy sea ship
N.B. { laboring heavy and shipped a great deal
of water at 3 O'clock. Inoperating
Enes with little wind but a heavy
small hauling to S.W. Lat 47.17 S
Long 63.47 W

Saturday Mch 9th
Capt Fisher Officer
to let the men out of
some of the men's hands
give a satisfactory
answer put him back
a gentle work his
own pleasure
Light air and calm heavy swell and
sea the Water Way seems have settled
and light. Hereafter we sea of the Pump
to night Enes with fine weather and
pleasant Boreses from N to N.W.
