

Remarks On Board Bark Laraver Off New Bedford

Sunday March 17th 1878
Commenced with a fresh Gale
and Squally from S.W. at 2 Am it
moderating and veering to W.S.W. set
double reefed Top Sails Coamings with
beared ship to S.E. at 7 light and
Middle had a strong breeze from NW
Course S.W. by S Top Sails and Coamings
at pm hauled to S.W. with a heavy
Squall ends with a heavy Gale

Monday March 18th
Commenced with a heavy Gale
and Requested Snow Squalls from
S.W. Oposide Jacks Close reefed
Main Top Sail and Storm Stay Sails
Middle Moderate winds from S.W.
but a heavy Sea a running set
double reefed Top Sails at daylight
Saw Staten Land bearing from
W.S.W. to N.W. at 7 veered ship
to the Southward ends with a
fresh Gale with frequent rain
and Snow Squalls

Tuesday March 19th
Commenced with fresh Gale and
Squally from W.S.W. and hauled
to W by a short time crossed S.W.
at 7 shifted to S.W. in a heavy
Squall hauled to S.W. and
close reefed the Main Ends with
fresh Gale and Squally at midday
a heavy Gale from S.W. veered
ship to S.S.E. Close reefed Main
Top Sail and Storm Stay Sails

Capt James H. Fisher Master Off Cape Horn

Wednesday March 20th 1878
Commenced with a heavy Gale from
S.W. here to on the Starboard Jack to
the S.S.E. Close reefed Main Top Sail
and Storm Stay Sails Ship laboring
very hard at 4 it blowed some snow
in gusts and squalls it blow heavy till
midnight then moderating at daylight
heavily calm between the squalls of
Capt Fisher let Snow and Gale Staten Land in
the men that was slight bearing N.W. by N ends with
in 10mg go to that light - water and frequent snow
duty on the beam of squalls from S.W.
good behavior

Thursday March 21st
Commenced with light breeze attended
with heavy Snow and Gale Squalls
from S.W. heading S.S.E. double reefed
Top Sails Coamings and with one sail in
sight Middle blowing strong took
Sail ends with a strong Gale and
a heavy Sea a running from S and
S.S.E. fair to in the Eastern Jack
thick Snow Storm No Obs

Friday March 22nd
Commenced with a strong Gale from
S.S.E. at 4 moderating and veered
to S.E. made double reefed Top Sails and
Coamings heading up S.W. by S at 9 came
in bad weather sail to close reefed Main
Top Sail and Storm Stay Sails Staten Land here
N.W. Middle fresh and light breeze from
S to S.W. Snow light breeze and fair
weather from S to S.W. Oposide Jack
to get all the Snow
