

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer Of New

Saturday Mch 23th 1878
Commenced with fresh and light
breezes from S to S.W all sail set
Statten Land bearing W and N.W
Middle fine weather from W.S.W by the
wind to the S. Breeze moderate some
light squalls at Meridian wind
bearing to the S. More ship to W.S.W
3 sails in light

Lat 56. 27 S
Long 63. 05 W

Sunday Mch 24th
Commenced with fresh breezes from
S by the wind to W.S.W all sail set
at 7 handed strong sails sent a new
one sail the old one getting very
poor not fit to trust to Middle
fresh breezes from S by the wind to
W.S.W all sail Breeze moderate

Lat 56. 15 S

Monday Mch 25th
Commenced with light breezes
and fine weather from S.E
by the wind to S.W at 4 Calm
Horn Head off Cape Horn in light
bearing W by S. Middle light breezes
with snow squalls from S.E and
S. Breeze with fresh breezes and
squally from S.E and S beating
off Cape Horn bearing W tack
and tack taking advantage of
breeze cannot stay strong
current running to the Eastward
and squalls

Lat 50. 10 S
Long 66. 32 W

Tuesday Mch 26th 1878
Commenced with strong breezes and
squally from S backed off shore to the
E.S.E. Carrying sail taught to hold on
for a short Middle fresh sail and
squally S.S.W stood in for the land 4
hours and off we hope to take in
tack with strong sail and heavy
squalls stood in saw a hulk
could not get past it was thick

Lat 56. 30 S

Wednesday Mch 27th
Commenced with a strong sail
and increasing to a heavy sail
at 6 from S.S.W to the S.E. Close reefed
main top sail and storm stay sails
Middle moderating some set fore
and main sail dotta double
reefed top sail strong sail at
Meridian saw the land bearing
W.S.W by compass thick mists

Thursday Mch 28th
Commenced strong sail from S.W
from double to close reefed top sails
heaving to S.E. Carrying sail hard
Throughout the 24 hours the same
thick and squally mists

Ship make
Scupper Water
through the
Deck Water
Way Leans

Friday Mch 29th
Commenced with a fair breeze
from S.W and veering to W.S.W carrying
all the sail we can Breeze with
a strong W.S.W sail opposite tack
saw 2 sails bound to the Eastward
