

Remarks On Board Bark Lancer Of New

Friday April 26th 1878
Commenced with strong Breeze and
thick weather from S Course North all
Sail Middle Fresh Talc double reefed
Top Sails Once Moderate Set Main
Top. Salant-Sail thick. No Obs

Saturday April 27th
Commenced with strong Breezes
and fine weather from S Course
N. all Sail Middle fine weather
Ends Light Breezes from S Course
N all Sail Employed washing ship
Lat 39.31 S
Long 75.25 W

Sunday April 28th
Commenced with light Breezes
and breezy from S. to S.E. Course
N.E. to all Sail Middle and latter
thick and hazy weather from S
at 10 P.m. Saw the Lancer Bay S.E. to
Course N.E. Lat 37.11 S

Monday April 29th
Commenced with fine weather
from S Course N.E. at dawn along
the land at 7.30 Saw the light on
the Island of Roerema bearing S.E. to
Middle light Breezes and fine weather
off and on once with light seas
and calm working into the Bay

Tuesday April 30th
Commenced light air from S at 6
came to anchor in the Bay about 12
further Port Anchor 30 fathoms from
at 4 took the anchor and went up to town
Once washing ship

Wednesday May 1st 1878
Commenced with thick and rainy finish
washing ship got ready for the Port work
Once with fine weather Employed a
cleaning the iron work watch on shore
night

Thursday May 2nd
Fine weather Employed cleaning
and painting iron work fitting
Bob. Slays Watch on shore night

Friday May 3rd
Fine weather cleaning iron and painting
it raising the new rigging watch on shore
night

Saturday May 4th
Thick and rainy weather Watch on
Liberty dropped the 2nd anchor

Sunday May 5th
Fine weather the same Watch on Liberty

Monday May 6th
Fine weather 4 of the Watch took
the Liberty Sills anchors and 2 Portages
Mr Murray has been absent since last
Friday night sent the 2 sick men
things on their being discharged had
a fair start off to work to day some
making out and setting up hooks

4th Mate absent -
against Orders
3rd Mate the same
