S.W. here on Western Tack Tides
with fresh breeze and fine weather
Employed at various jobs

Sunday June 16th
Commenced with Fresh Breeze
from S.W. to S. Course NW
Tides with fine weather from S.E.
Steering off to N.W.

Monday June 17th
Commenced with fine weather
from S.E. heading to the Eastward
Sailing with the Sheet Wing and
J.A. Howland Tides with fine
weather from S.E. by the wind to the
S.W. Employed repairing the
2 Boat with various jobs
Lat 34.14 S
Long 83.27 W

Tuesday June 18th
Commenced with fine weather
from S.E. to S.E. 2 Sails in Sight
Throughout these 24 hours the
Same

Wednesday June 19th
Commenced with fine weather
from S.E. by the wind Opposite
Tacks all Sails nothing in Sight
Tides with fine weather from
S.E. Steering off W. Easy Sails
Employed at various jobs
Lat 34.21 S
Long 84.02 W

Thursday June 20th 1878
Commenced with thick and cloudy
weather from S.E. Steering off to N.W.
Saw 2 Sails Throughout these 24
hours the Same Course NW
Employed Taring down the Head
Stays with various jobs on the rigging
Lat 29.25 S
Long 86.21 W

Friday June 21st
Commenced with strong Breezes and
fine weather from S.E. Course NW
and NW all Sails Employed on the
Rigging Tides with strong breezes and
Squally from S.E. to S. Course NW

Saturday June 22nd
Commenced with strong Breezes
and Squally from S. Course NW
all Sails Middle wind veering to
E.S.E. Tides the Same Squally the
Course NW all Sails Employed at
various jobs Lat 23.49 S
Long 89.47 W

Sunday June 23rd
Commenced with fine weather
from E.S.E. Course NW all Sails
Throughout these 24 hours the Same

Monday June 24th
Fine weather from S.E. Course
NW Tides strong Breeze Steering off
W. Employed setting up the Main
Rigging Lat 19.57 S
Long 91.49 W
