

Remarks On Board Bark Larmer Of New

Tuesday June 25th 1878
Strong Breeze and squalls by the wind
to S.W. about 10 A.M. Top Sail's down
at various jobs on the rigging and
Carpentering done with strong
S.E. Trades and light rain squalls

Wednesday June 26th
Commenced with fresh Trades and
frequent rain squalls. Throughout
the 24 hours the same
Lat 20° 14' S
Long 91° 45' W

Thursday June 27th
Commenced with fresh Trades and
squalls. Employed in the rigging
ended the same at 8 A.M. after light
Saw sperm Whales close to the ship
galled going quick to windward
made all sail after then saw
them no more

Friday June 28th
Commenced with fresh Trades
and squalls. Opposite Jacks by the
wind. Trades fine weather. Employed
ketching down the main rigging
Lat
Long

Saturday June 29th
Commenced with fresh Trades
and fine weather. Employed on
the rigging. Trades with strong
Trades and squalls. Employed
on the rigging. No Ob.

Sunday June 30th 1878
Strong Trades and squalls
Throughout the 24 hours strong Trades
with frequent squalls by the wind
Opposite Jacks
Lat 19° 56' S
Long 92° 13' W

Monday July 1st
Commenced with strong Trades and
squalls and fine rain. Trades with
strong Trades and squalls. Saw
skinbacks

Tuesday July 2nd
Strong Trades and rain squalls
Middle and the same strong
Trades. Saw nothing but skinbacks

Wednesday July 3rd
Strong Trades and heavy touch
on the rigging fore and aft the ship
Trades with strong Trades and
heavy squalls with rain
Lat 20° 04' S
Long

Thursday July 4th
Commenced with strong Trades
with heavy squalls. Ends the same

Friday July 5th
Strong Trades, heavy and rain squalls
Ends with heavy bad weather
Employed at various jobs
